Maritime Union To Vote on Strike

NEW YORK, Apr. 30—(INS)—The 100,000 members of the CIO National Maritime Union will begin a strike vote on May 4.

The union announced tonight that members will decide whether to strike to win their demands for a wage increase and other benefits including cost-of-living bonuses to take the place of the war bonuses eliminated last year.

Negotiations with the shipowners have been under way for some six months, the NMU stated, and the owners have "flatly rejected" all the union demands.

GARY, Ind., Apr. 30—(AP)—The body of First Lt. Robert Shoemaker, 26, Watertown, Wis., pilot of a plane which disappeared over Lake Michigan on a flight from Columbus to Chicago, last month, has been recovered from the lake. Bodies of two passengers in the plane had been recovered previously.

Czechs To Seek Kladno Region

PRAGUE, Apr. 30—(AP)—Josef David, speaker of the Czech parliament, said today that Czechoslovakia would insist at the Paris peace conference that she be given the Kladno region, despite Polish demands for the same territory.

David said that the recent Polish-Czechoslovak negotiations over the territory failed and that Czechoslovakia would under no circumstances yield to a Polish demand for Teschen.

Looking At HOLLYWOOD with ERSKINE JOHNSON

HOLLYWOOD, Apr. 30—(NEA)—"The Outlaw" is smashing all box-office records at every theatre it plays. Howard Hughes, already a millionaire, has one of the greatest popular attractions in the history of the movies.

The picture will gross \$10,000,000. Harry Gold, in charge of its world-wide distribution, told us, "We've got what the guy on the street wants, and we're selling it with showmanship—the red carnation and 'Step closer, folks.' The 'Outlaw' is clicking because the guy on the street today is choosing the entertainment he wants to see."

Harry talks the lingo of the film salesman. He's been one for 27 years. As vice president in charge of sales for United Artists since its inception, he has helped sell Hughes' first big hit, "Hell's Angels," as well as Fairbanks, Griffith and Chaplin movies.

"They knew showmanship," he says. "Today it's all cut-and-dried stuff for big studios. We're putting the 'oomph' back in showmanship."

"Break" Pays Off, the GI pianist's Eugene List, the GI pianist who played for Stalin, Churchill and President Truman at the Potsdam conference, told us over a beer the other afternoon that his "lucky break" will gross him \$1,320,000 within the next two years.

He figures that in that time he will do 45 concerts at \$2,500 each. He has finished five radio shows at the same price, is getting about \$50,000 for a role in Andrew Stone's new movie, "Bachelor's Daughters," and will earn \$20,000 more from records due to be released soon.
