PROTEST CPA PERMIT PROGRAM

Official Says Unessential Construction Is Being Approved

MANSFIELD, May 3—(UP)—William R. Allen, director of the veterans information center here, today charged that the Civilian Production Administration is "un-nerminating" the veterans' emergency housing program by permitting "unessential" construction.

Allen resigned yesterday his post as vice chairman of the Mansfield CPA advisory committee after criticizing the CPA for approving construction in Mansfield of a supermarket, a church and other business buildings. He said they were "unessential at this time."

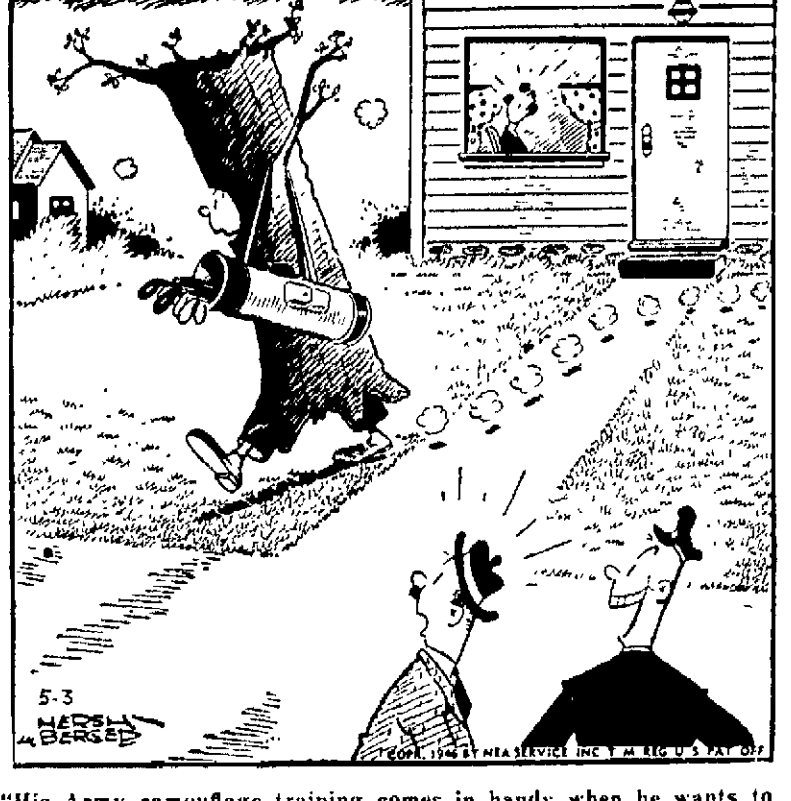
He charged that the Mansfield CPA advisory group has never been asked by Cleveland CPA officials for advice on the essentiality of proposed construction here.

Allen said he sent a letter to Wilson Wyatt, national housing capeditor, charging that the Cleveland office of the CPA is issuing permits without regard for community needs. He said that Mansfield, for example, already has 55 churches and another one was approved. He pointed out that a supermarket has been approved, costing \$75,000, in the downtown section where groceries and markets now are available.

"Such building without a doubt is proper and right in its own time but not in these critical times when daily we are finding veterans' homes broken up and veterans forced to live in places and under conditions that would not exist if the war had not taken them from their homes to serve their country," he said.

HIGH AT UNION

Andrews Awaits Commitment To Penitentiary

CINCINNATI, May 3—(UP)—Frank Andrews, convicted Cincinnati policy operator, was returned to Cincinnati to face a Hamilton-co criminal court hearing today prior to commitment to the Ohio penitentiary for a one-to-seven year sentence.

Andrews, who was refused admittance to Ohio penitentiary yesterday by Warden Frank Henderson because he had no papers, was brought from Columbus to Cincinnati by Hamilton-co Sheriff's Deputy Clifford Yockey and Capt. William J. Wiggeringloh of the Cincinnati police department. Andrews was held for six hours in the Franklin-co jail yesterday for the Cincinnati officials.

Andrews was at liberty under a \$10,000 bond pending an appeal on his conviction, and was turned down by the Ohio supreme court. He attempted to gain admittance at the penitentiary after failing to surrender to the Cincinnati sheriff. Andrews told police that he went direct to Columbus because he wished to avoid further publicity. The Cincinnati police said Andrews must appear before the Hamilton county court to be committed. Forfeiture of his bond also will be discussed then.
