Paralyzed Vet Awaits Check From Railway

CHICAGO, May 4—(UP)—Lying paralyzed on his bed in the Vaughn General hospital, Veteran Arthur W. Jahns, 26, of Fremont O., today is awaiting a \$100,000 check from the Pennsylvania Railroad—the largest out-of-court settlement for a railroad injury case in the history of Cook-co.

Jahns, en route to an Army rest camp after long months of overseas fighting, suffered a severed spinal cord when a Pennsylvania train was derailed at Piqua, O., Mar. 21, 1945.

The record settlement was made by Superior Judge John F. Hass in his chambers after a jury already had been selected to hear the case.

The injured veteran was taken into court on a stretcher, an ever-present nurse in attendance. The railroad had assumed liability, but the jury was to determine the amount of the damages.

Jahns, who went directly from his father's farm into the Army in 1942, wears five battle stars and fought in Africa, Italy, Sicily, France, Belgium and Germany. He never was scratched in battle.
