Coal Production Continues Drop

WASHINGTON, May 4—(INS)—Soft coal production already has fallen 15.9 per cent behind the 1945 output because of the continuing strike of members of the United Mine Workers.

The National Coal-ash estimated today that bituminous coal production totaled approximately 750,000 tons during the week ended Apr. 27, compared with 12,231,000 in the corresponding week last year.

The total for the year is approximately 163,899,000 tons, compared with 194,983,000 tons thru Apr. 28, 1945.
