Tarzan comes to the State in the form of Johnny Weissmuller in "Tarzan and the Leopard Woman." Sharing the bill is "I Was Faithful."

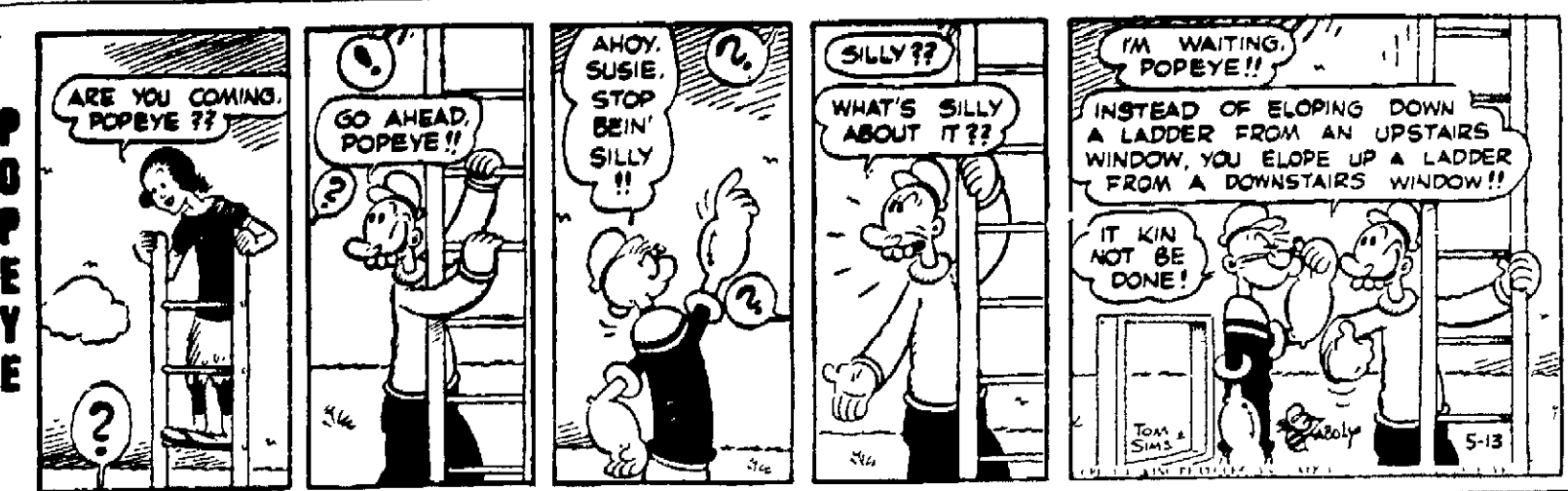
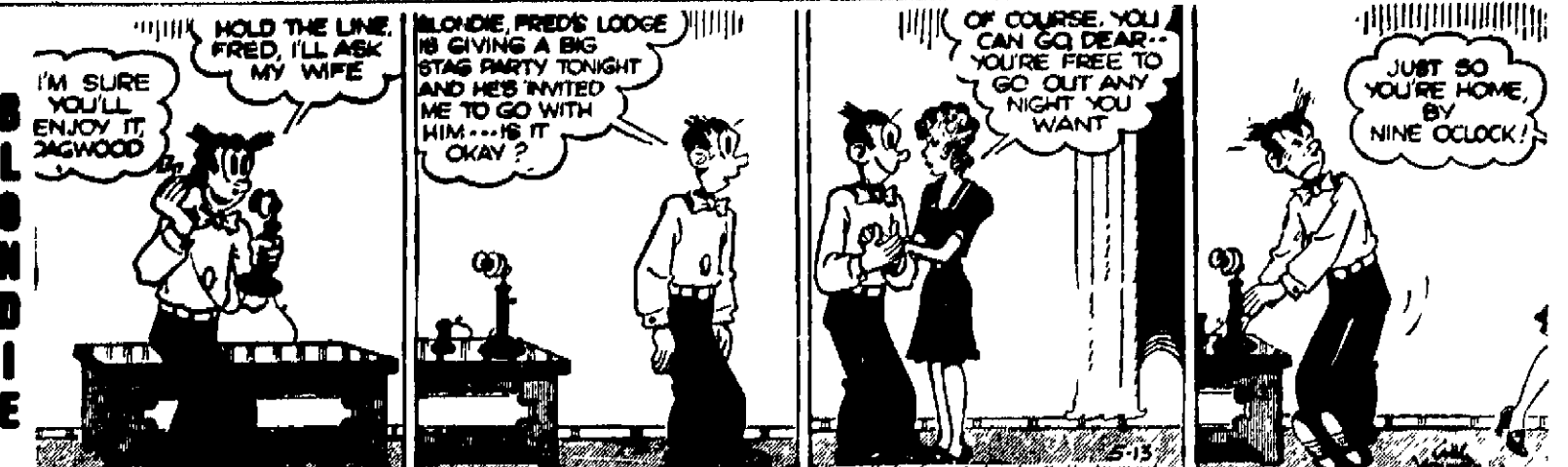
