Bernhardt disposed of Trigger and a Quiz Kid quickly. "I'm just plain poison to animals. I hear Quiz Kids are nice, but when I direct a picture I want to know all the answers."

Paulette's No "Kitty" Ex-Staff Sergeant Phil Arnold of the Army, guest-starting on the Ginny Simms show, complained that everyone was miscast in Hollywood pictures, especially Paulette Goddard as "Kitty." "I think Paulette makes a lovely Kitty," bit Ginny. "Oh, yeah?" said Phil. "Can you imagine anyone's wanting to put HER out at night?"

Gloria Warren is making a comeback in Hollywood—at the age of 20. Five years ago, she was starred in "Always in My Heart." She'll play a society girl in Producer Jeffrey Bernerd's "Don't Gamble With Strangers."

Gives Warning Over Tripoli

Pig Production Slash Is Urged

WASHINGTON, May 14—(INS)—Secretary of Agriculture Anderson has called for a 10 per cent cut in the 1946 pig production goal to conserve critically-needed grain supplies for famine relief.

The national autumn pig goal was set at 31,500,000 head, or about 10 per cent less than production last fall.

Meanwhile, Economic Stabilizer Bowles in a broadcast over the ABC network, declared the nation would feel a "pinch" in the meat supply next winter and spring. He added:

"We aren't going to like it very much. But we like ourselves a lot less if we went on blindly stuffing our mouths while we defaulted on our plain obligations to the starving of this earth."

Kidnapers Seize Gambling Chief

CHICAGO, May 14—(UP)—Underworld sources believed today that Edward P. Jones, 48, multi-millionaire Negro gambling overlord, would be held by kidnapers until he surrenders control of Chicago's fabulous policy racket, or be killed if he does not.

Police believed Jones may have been kidnaped by former henchmen of Scarface Al Capone, who have been fighting for control of the city's lucrative gambling business. Fearing the worst, they searched alleys and catch basins of the south side Negro districts. Jones, who rose from dining car waiter to millionaire and lived in a Michigan-av mansion, was kidnaped late Saturday night by four masked men who stopped pursuing police with blasts from sub-machineguns.

Investigators did not overlook the possibility that Jones was kidnaped for ransom, possibly by white men who served with him in federal prison at Terre Haute, Ind., where he did a 28-month stretch for income tax evasion.
