

'Gilda' To Open Wednesday At Quilna Theatre for Week

Something excitingly different in the way of romantic dramas has been promised for Lima fans and it has finally arrived at the Quilna theatre in the shape of the film "Gilda" with Rita Hayworth and Glenn Ford opening a day ahead of schedule.

Gilda—ravishing, high-spirited, dangerous—is the central figure of a strange and moving love triangle. Her boy friend, Johnny Farrell, played by Glenn Ford, who ran out on her before she was married, and who turns up as her husband's best friend and trusted lieutenant, is a bitter vindictive young gambler. Miss Hayworth has a role distinctly suited to her glamorous allure allowing her, too, to sing and dance in a few sequences . . . a movie calculated to satisfy the most musical-minded of her fans.

A musical extravaganza filmed in technicolor and living up to everything which Florenz Zeigfeld would have wanted in any show of his is the film "Zeigfeld Folies" now showing at the Ohio. With a cast roster that would make any show house proud to host, the film comes at a time when enthusiasm in movies is beginning to lag because of the summer. It's good entertainment for the whole family.

William Powell is currently to be seen at the Sigma in a film which will bring back old memories to the folk who remember Powell in his younger movie-making days. The film is similar to those which he made some years back and has a couple of up-and-coming stars of today, Esther Williams and Angela Lansbury. Both prove themselves accomplished actresses in this film which involves both comedy, romance and suspense.

HOLLYWOOD, May 15—(NEA)—Strictly in the interests of the column, we had lunch the other day with a 23-year-old brunette who is collecting \$3100 a month in alimony. This, so far as we know, is a record, even for Hollywood. The young lady is Cleatus Caldwell, the ex-wife of comedian Ken Murray.

Ken used to carry her books home from Fairfax high school. Now she carries his money to the bank every week. They were married five days after her graduation, in 1940, had two children, and were recently divorced.

Cleatus explained that the \$3100 a month is part of their financial settlement for the care of herself and the children. She got \$22,000 cash and gets the \$3100 for a year. Then it drops to only \$1100 a month until she remarries.

He'd Better Be Funny We asked her if she thought comedian Murray was funny.

"Naturally," she said, "and he'd better be." Cleatus's \$3100-a-month payments depend on whether Ken's Hollywood stage show, "Blackouts," continues to attract the customers. It's now in its fifth year, so the danger is remote.

"Blackouts," she said, was mostly responsible for their divorce. "Ken played golf all day, had dinner with the boys, went to the show every night, and then played gin-rummy until 3 a. m. I never saw him. He just backed out of our family life."

"I'm really serious about a career," she said. "And I can prove it—they deduct everything I earn from the \$3100 a month. All my friends hope I'll become a star—Ken is my biggest booster—the more I earn the less he has to pay. He's practically my agent."
