

Glimpse Back of Yesterday In Ohio's Picture Friday

A rare and exciting glimpse into the glitter of yesterday awaits those moviegoers who visit the Ohio theatre Friday where the hard-boiled and suspenseful new drama, "Her Kind of Man" will be opening. Basically as much a portrait of the late Twenties as is the individual story of Steve Maddox, played by Zachary Scott, the picture picks up the threads of Steve's life at a point where social extravagances have reached their peak.

Packed with action which have made Rita Hayworth a star much in demand for action pictures in Hollywood is her recent film "Gilda" now playing at the Quilna. Glenn Ford shares the starring honors in this film.

Opening at the Allen Friday will be the western film, "Riding Sunset Trail" with Tom Keene and "Cowboy Commandos," two western films.

Joseph Cotten and Jennifer Jones will come to the Majestic Sunday in "Love Letters." Now showing at the theatre are "This Gun for Hire" with Alan Ladd and Veronica Lake; also "Stork Club."

Death Reduces Family of 13

PORTSMOUTH, May 16—(AP)—A family of 13 had been reduced to five today with violent death accounting for six members in the last three decades. Two others died after illnesses.

The eighth to die was James Albert Boggs, 62, whose body was removed from the Ohio river yesterday after he fell in while trying to lift a pump to a barge.

During the previous 33 years, seven of his children died, five of them violently. They were:

Sons, Mason (drowning), Charles (dragged by runaway that struck his school), Miller (a horse fell on him).

Daughters, Mary Catherine (burned to death), Laura Mae (tuberculosis) and Myrtle (pneumonia).

Boggs' widow, Tillie, and four sons survive.

One Man Is Killed By Italian Bomb

NAPLES, May 16—(INS)—Italy's plebiscite campaign, to determine the future of the king, claimed at least one life today when a bomb was thrown among Monarchist demonstrators. Thirty-five persons were injured, four critically.

Italian police said they believed the explosive came from Communist headquarters at Piazza San Lorenzo after Monarchists taunted the Reds with catcalls and boos. A young Communist was held in connection with the incident.

Our nomination for the best acting performance of the week goes today to Miss Joan Bennett. While the camera's inquisitive eyes peeked thru a tent flap, Joan looked "a little like after" for a fleeting shot in the picture "The Short Happy Life of Francis Macomber."

It was Director Zoltan Korda's idea, we must report, but Joan followed thru like a Barrymore. After all, looking "a little like after" is quite a trick.

The movie is about an African lion hunt, based on a 22-page short story by Ernest Hemingway. Joan and her husband (Robert Preston) go hunting lions, with a handsome devil named Gregory Peck as their guide.

It isn't long before Joan, a lady with a roving eye, finds Peck much more exciting than lions. (Hollywood has to have a triangle, even in darkest Africa.) So one night Joan unzips her tent flap and mosquito netting, tiptoes past her sleeping husband, and visits Peck in his tent.

Joan had just returned from her nocturnal call, and Director Korda was filming the scene in which she sneaks back to her tent and climbs back into bed, unmindful that husband Preston had awakened and knew what was going on all the time.

A Pretty Problem
Joan wondered just how she should look as the camera followed her back to bed.

Director Korda thought for a while and then said: "I think Joan should just look a little like after."

So, Joan looked "a little like after," thereby winning our nomination for the best acting performance of the week.

"The Short Happy Life of Francis Macomber"—and you can bet the title will be changed—is Hemingway's best short story. Producer Benedict Bogaus bought the film rights for \$85,000.
