Ford Motor Co. Hikes Surplus

BOSTON, May 23—(UP)—The Ford Motor Co. increased its surplus by \$12,264,280 during 1945, according to its balance sheet filed today with the Massachusetts State Tax Commissioner.

Total surplus at the end of 1945 was \$697,298,372 as compared with \$685,034,092 in 1944, \$669,102,290 in 1943, \$623,573,391 in 1942, \$612,678,531 in 1941 and \$607,628,389 in the pre-war year of 1940.

Filed only in Massachusetts, the annual certificate of condition is the first indication of the company's operating results for the year. Ford publishes no income account and no information is available concerning dividend payments as the corporation's stock is owned wholly by the Ford family.

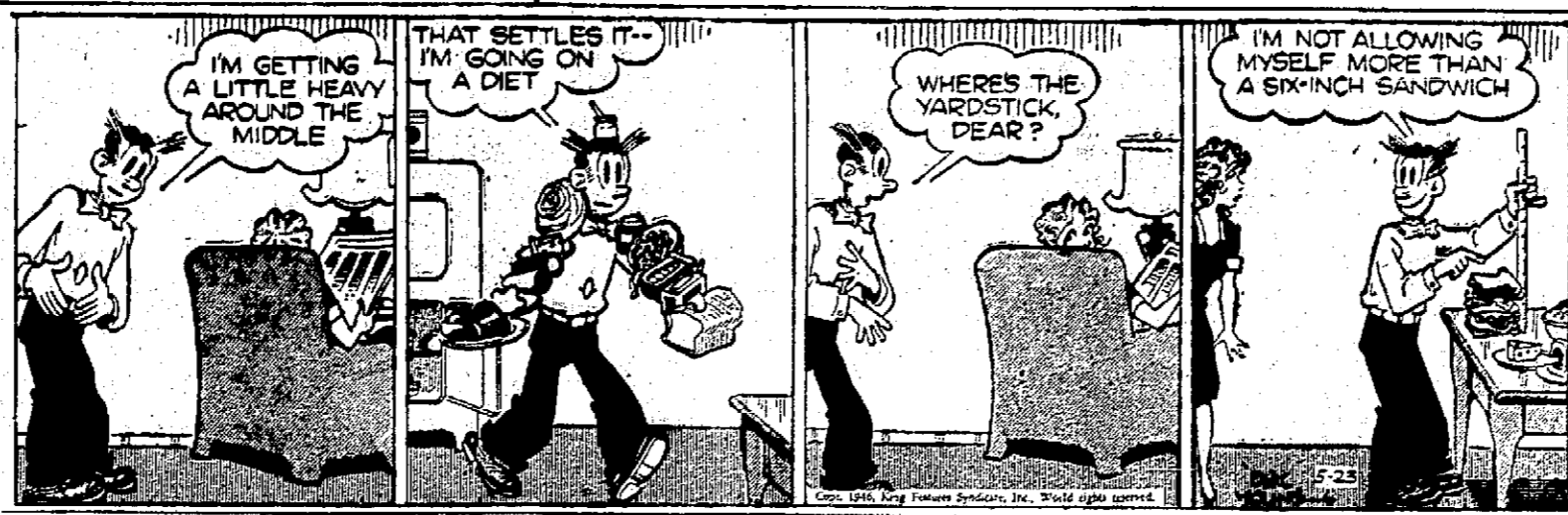
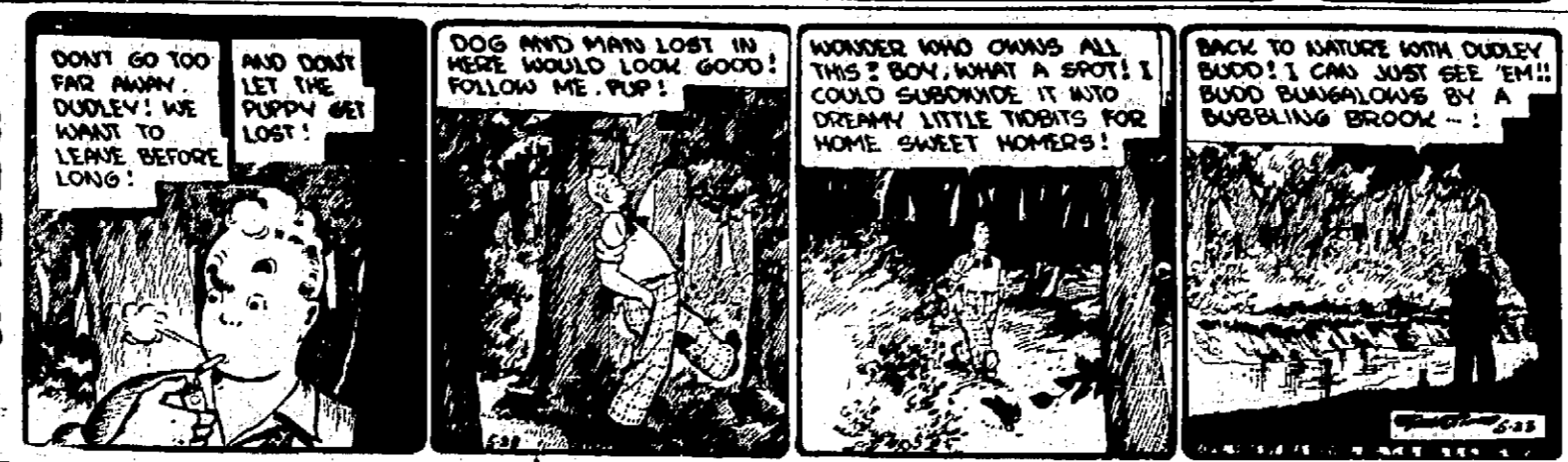
