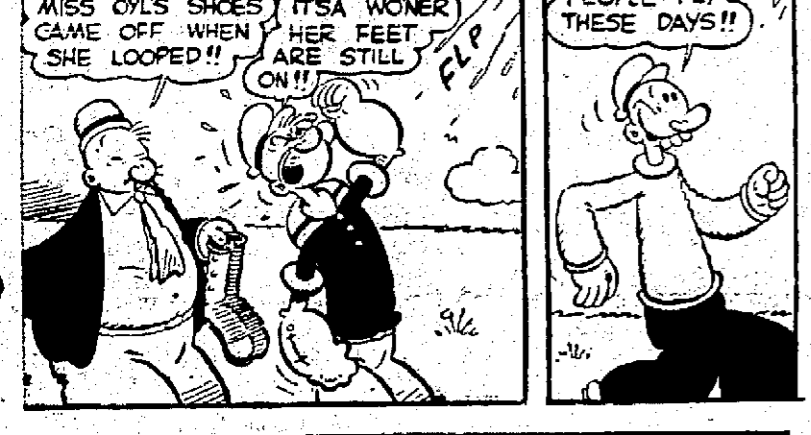

Fremont Plant Back At Work after Lag

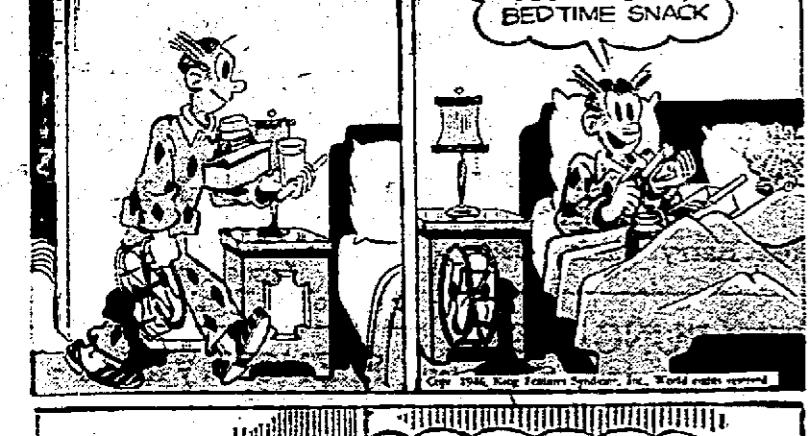
FREMONT, June 10—(AP)—Work resumed at the Fremont foundry today with 175 CIO-United Steelworkers returning for the first time since Jan. 21.

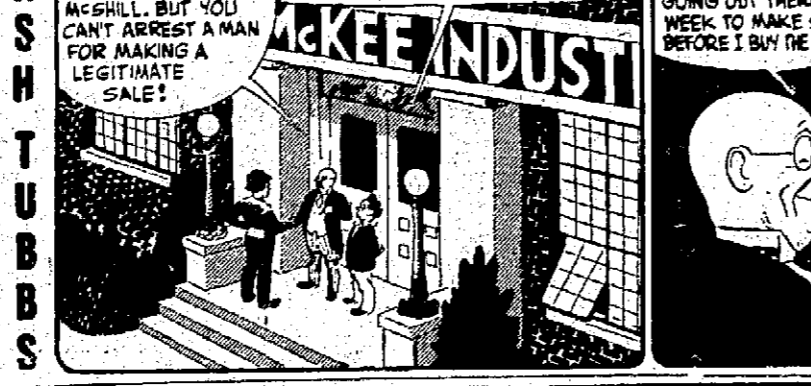
