British Forced Battle on Tito, Mihailovic Says

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia, June 12.—(AP)—Gen. Draja Mihailovic testified in his trial for his life today that a British mission to Yugoslavia instructed him to destroy the partisan forces of Marshal Tito.

The Chetnik leader, accused of treason and collaboration with the Germans, was on trial before a three-man court established by the regime which Tito now heads as premier. Tito returned on the opening day of the trial from two weeks of confinement in Moscow.

Mihailovic, on the stand for the second day, described the relations of his underground troops with the Germans during the occupation of Yugoslavia in 1943 as "not co-operation but haphazard mutual battle."

Prisoner Slain In Gun Battle With Marshals

KANSAS CITY, Kan., June 12.—(INS)—A spectacular gun battle between federal prisoners and two deputy U. S. marshals left one man today dead and two others wounded, one critically.

Donald Dube, 21, of Greenfield, Mass., a prisoner being taken to Leavenworth penitentiary, was killed.

Seriously wounded was Joseph Wilson, 65, of Salisaw, Okla., a deputy U. S. marshal. A second prisoner, R. J. Job, 47, suffered bullet wounds in the wrist and shoulder.

The gun battle occurred yesterday 15 miles from the prison when the car was stalled by a blowout. Wilson and the second deputy marshal, William Thomas of Chickasaw, Okla., got out to fix the tire.

On resumption of the trip, Dube suddenly brandished a .38 calibre pistol. Dube fired five bullets into Wilson.

Deputy Marshal Thomas brought the car to a halt, whipped out a gun and pumped five bullets into Dube's upper body. The prisoner was killed instantly. In the exchange, Job, the second prisoner, was shot twice. Thomas was not injured.

Authorities said Dube apparently obtained the weapon he used from the glove compartment of the automobile while the officers were repairing the tire.
