

Western Film on Tap Friday For Quilna Theatregoers

Movie fans admittedly enjoy their Western films—they thrill to the bristling action, the flashing guns of a hard-riding outlaw band, the rough-and-tumble barroom brawls and this is to be found in "The Renegades" opening Friday at the Quilna theatre.

When Hollywood goes all-out on a Western film, it usually comes up with its best form in entertainment. By deftly combining action, adventure and romance, fully exploiting the magic of technicolor, this film is a sure fire hit.

Don't for one minute construe the title of the picture coming next to the Sigma. "The Blue Dahlia" is not, by any stretch of the imagination, anything so dignified as a flower show, or the unveiling of a horticulturist's latest hybrid. Actually, this production is an action-packed, smoothly suspenseful murder thriller that provides an excellent vehicle for its three stars, Alan Ladd, Veronica Lake and William Bendix.

Stadium Death Verdict Holds

COLUMBUS, June 14—(AP)—Coroner John B. Gravis confronted with a contention that Donald H. Shields was pushed to his death from atop the Ohio State university stadium, today refused to change his verdict of accidental death.

The information was submitted to the school by the 21-year-old OSU junior's father, Harry T. Shields of Newark, O., but Dr. Gravis asserted: "There is not enough information to warrant reopening an investigation."

Young Shields died June 4 in

what police described as a 98-foot fall from the stadium top. The boy's father told OSU President Howard L. Bevis that he probably was pushed in a robbery attempt.

Meantime four teen-aged eye witnesses last night informed Dr. Bevis that they had seen Shields in his fall from just below the stadium top. The father had said that Donald fell from an archway 40 feet above the ground.
