Green Approves Veterans Bonus

SPRINGFIELD, Ill. — (AP) — Another special session of the state legislature appeared certain today as officials turned their attention to solution of the veterans' housing shortage after enacting the nation's largest soldiers' bonus.

Gov. Dwight H. Green signed the \$385,000,000 bonus bill late Friday. The Republican-sponsored bonus bill, constant target for Democratic critics, arrived on the governor's desk intact.

Green indicated the state's job for the veteran is only partially complete. The administration now faces the tough housing situation which house and senate Democrats brought up repeatedly in the session just ended.
