Shanghai Lifts Wartime Curfew

SHANGHAI, Sunday, June 17 (AP)—The curfew imposed on Shanghai's 4,000,000 inhabitants since the outbreak of Sino-Japanese hostilities in 1937 was lifted at midnight Saturday, but an order requiring all places of amusement to close by 11 p. m. was maintained.

The curfew for Allied military personnel also was lifted by their respective authorities, except for the U. S. Navy, which has not yet acted.

Arms Traffic Is Uncovered

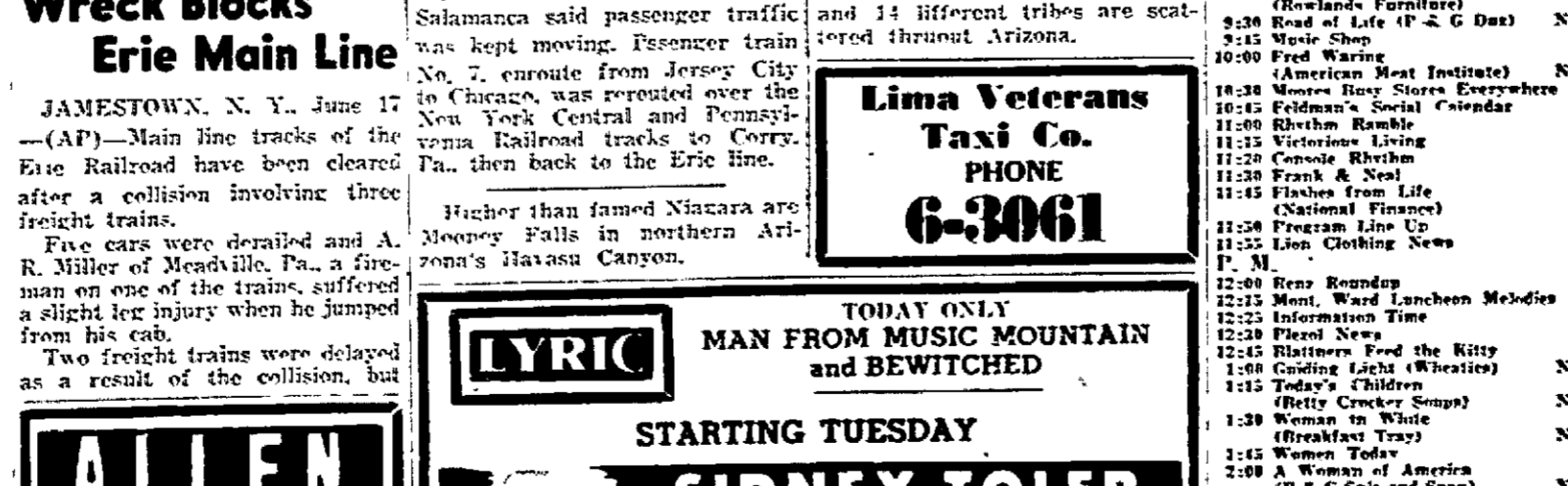
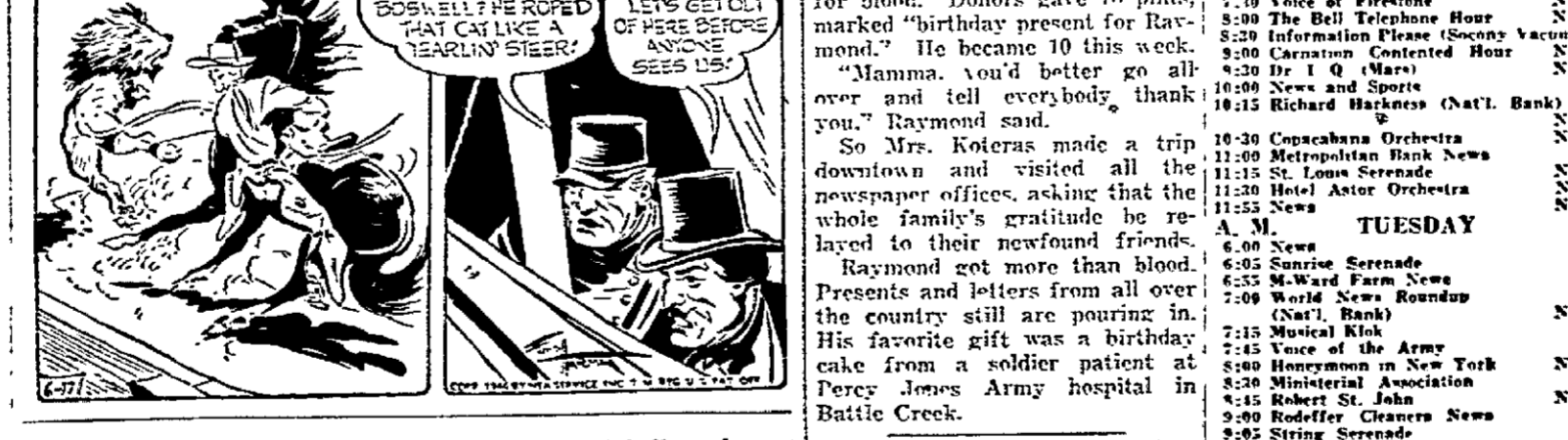
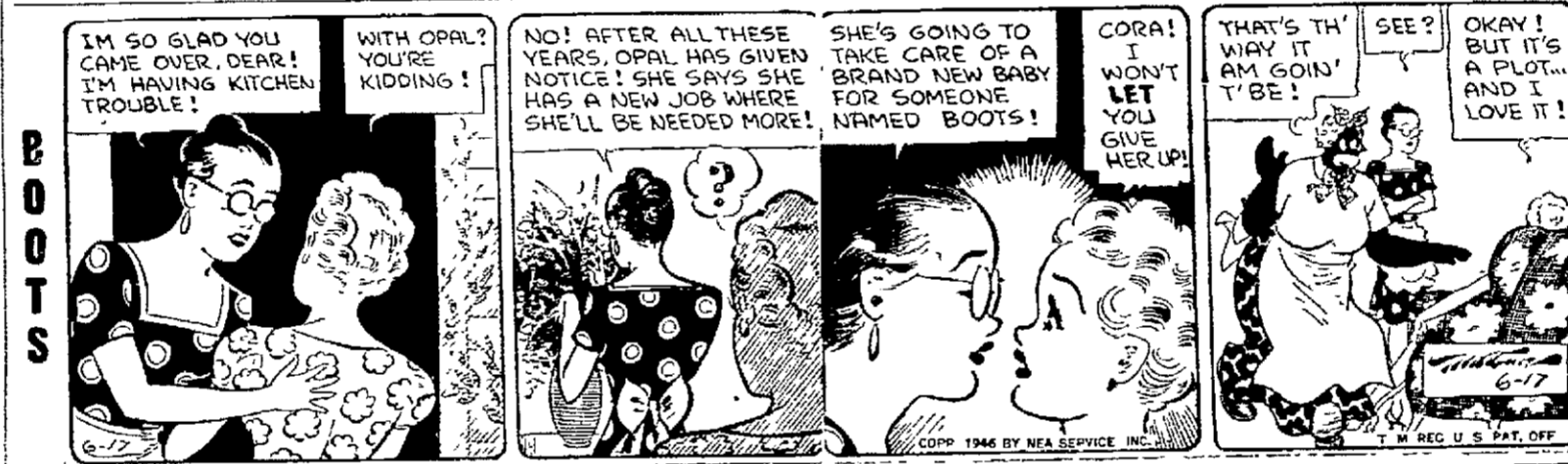
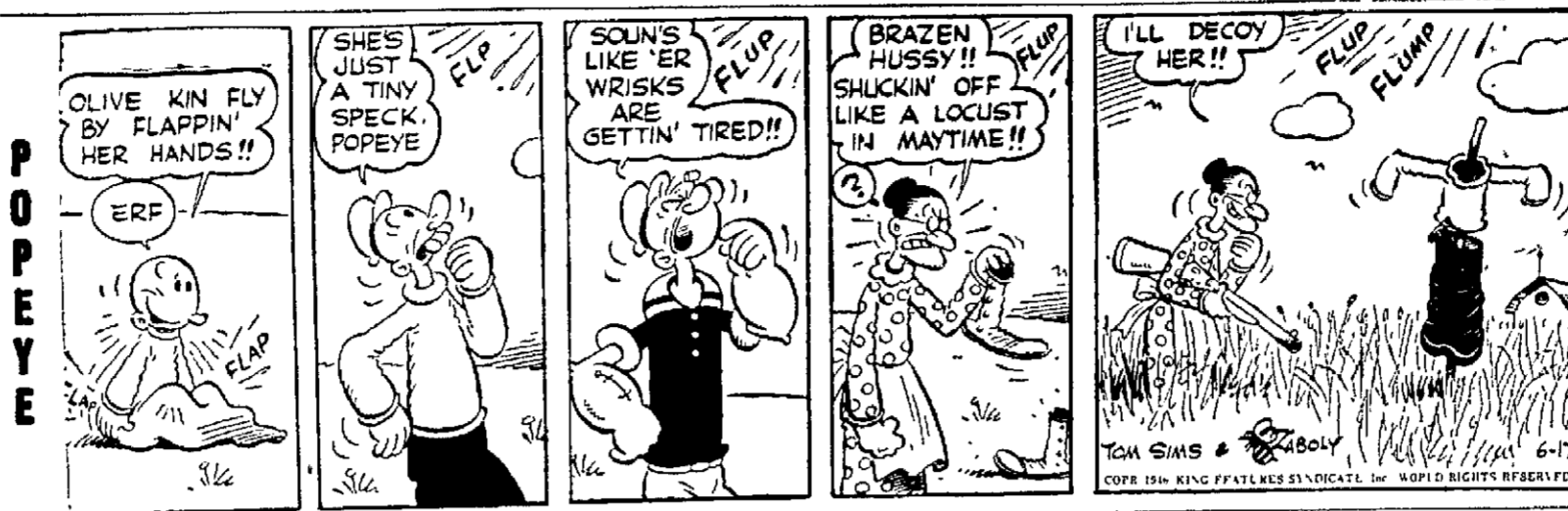
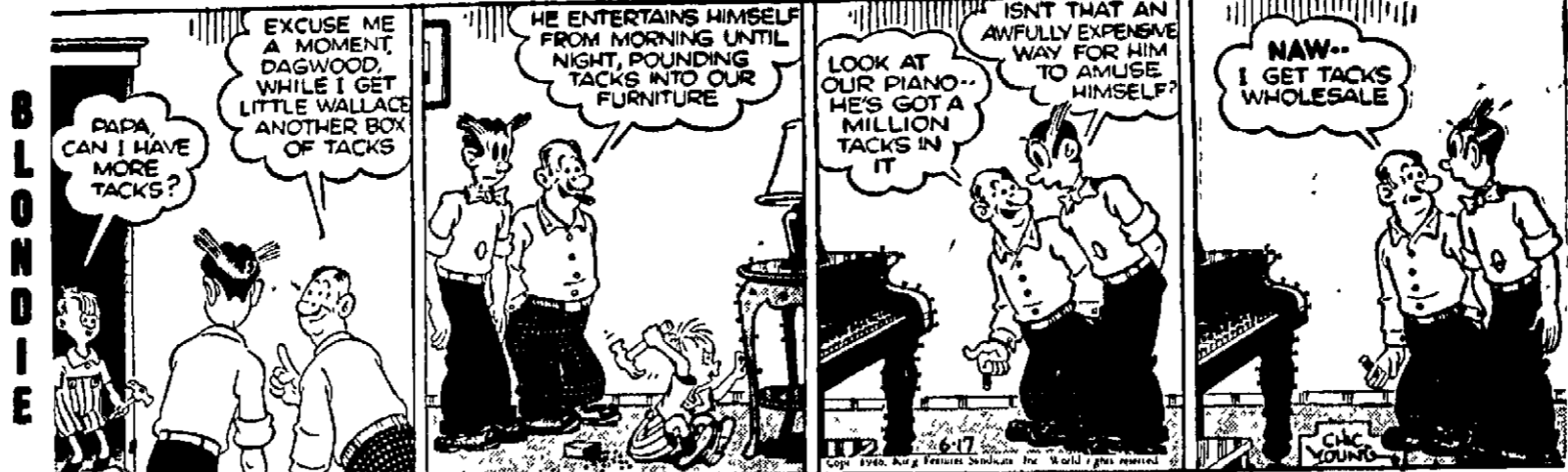
PARIS, June 17 (AP)—The ministry of the interior said tonight in a communique that apparently an international traffic in arms crossing France had been uncovered with the finding of 40 tons of guns and ammunition in a chateau near Bordeaux.

An inquiry, in which British police joined French officials, continued in an effort to determine the origin and destination of the weapons.

So far only a groundkeeper at the chateau, Jean Boscowitz, has been held by police for questioning. The ministry said that from his statements the cache appeared to represent international traffic in weapons.
