Reuther Raps Meal Increase DETROIT, June 21—(INS)—UAW-CIO President Walter P. Reuther today demanded that the OPA order permitting an increase in restaurant prices be revoked and that the OPA staff members responsible for its issuance be asked to resign. Reuther charged the price-mixing regulation is a "tipoff" that OPA is planning removal of ceiling prices from hundreds of food items which are bought by housewives as well as restaurants.
