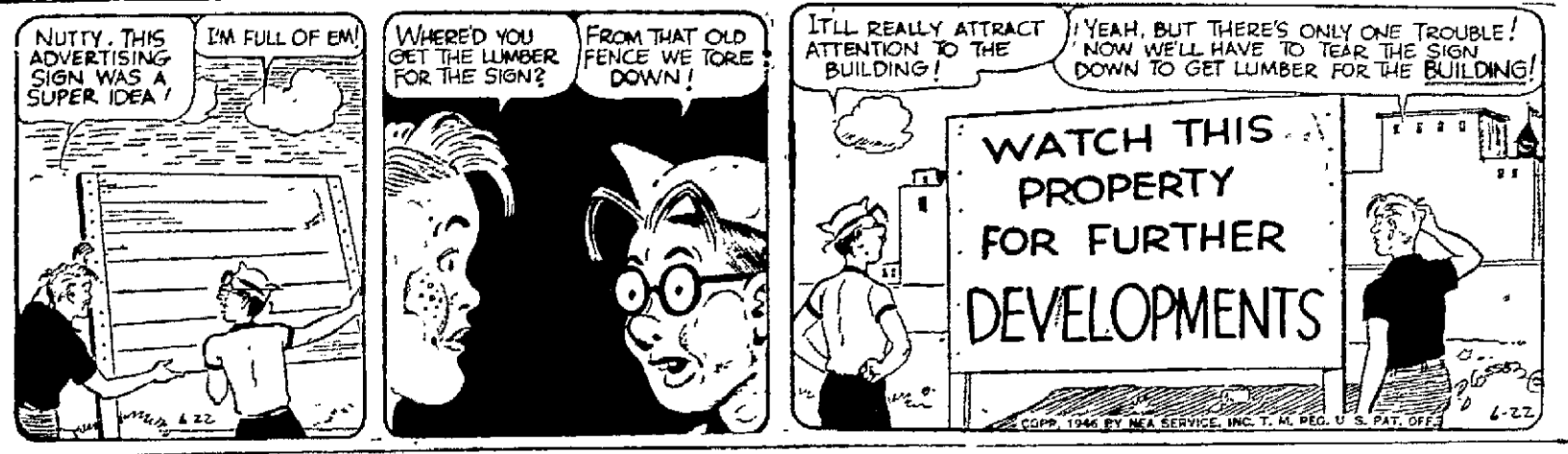
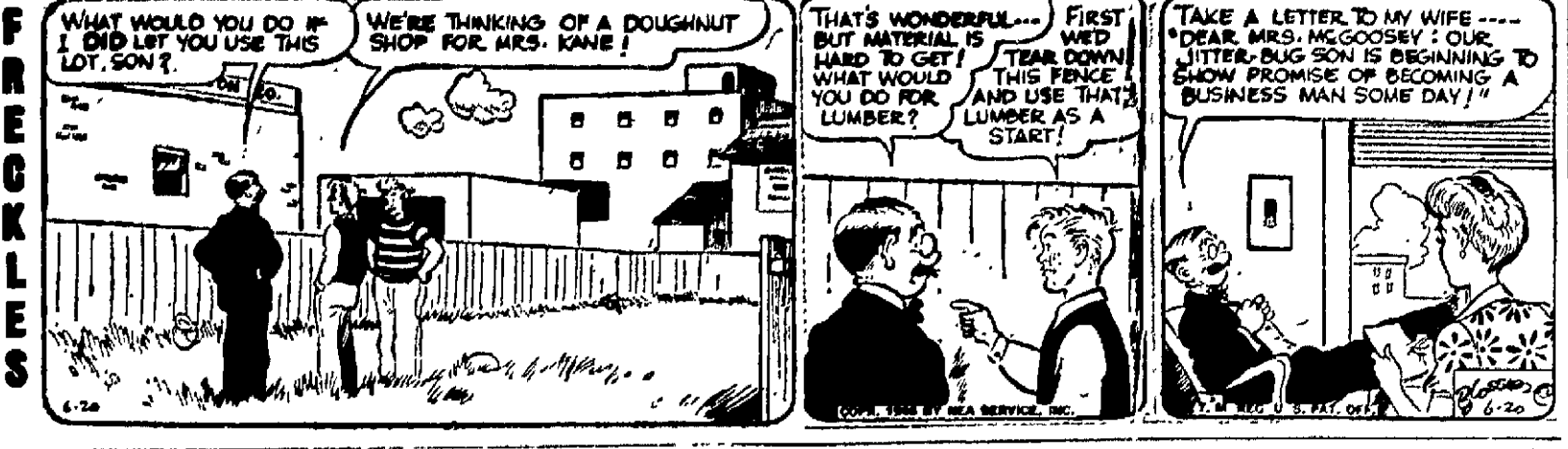

AFL Plumbers Seek \$2 Hourly Wages

CLEVELAND, June 22—(AP)—The AFL plumbers union last night voted to strike after 30 days if their demands for a 15-cent-an-hour increase is not met. C. J. Maher, union business agent representative reported.

The plumbers union obtained a 12-cent raise effective Mar. 1, which brought their scale to \$1.85, or 15 cents below the rate of other top-paying building craftsmen.

Construction work in Cuyahoga, Geauga and Lake-counts has been crippled for the last 18 days by an AFL carpenters strike for a 35-cent increase to bring their scale to \$2.

JAPS STUDY PATROL COLUMBUS, June 22—(AP)—

Japanese police soon will be studying the way the Ohio highway patrol "gets their man." Patrol Superintendent George Mingle said a description of the force's training school was being prepared for transmission to a staff reorganizing the Japanese police system. The patrol has conducted 20 schools, graduating an average of 30 men, since 1932.

BOWLING GREEN, June 22—(UP)—Closing arguments in the first degree murder trial of Arthur Peebles, 55, were delayed today until Monday after both the state and defense rested their case yesterday.

Peebles claimed during the trial that the death of Eugene Roth occurred as an accident when the 28-year-old man grabbed a gun. Roth was shot following the argument over ownership of a gasoline tank he attempted to remove from a farm owned by Peebles.

HAMILTON, June 22—(AP)—Twenty-three-year-old John F. Hayward must spend a life term in prison in the slaying last Oct. 31 of Mrs. Fannie C. Conrad, 73-year-old widow.

A three-judge court found him guilty of first degree murder last night but made life imprisonment mandatory by recommending mercy.
