

Oscar Levant Guest Stars On 'Fred Allen' Show Sunday

The musical notes emanating from Allen's Alley Sunday evening will be those of Oscar Levant when he guests with Fred Allen on the program heard at 7:30 over NBC.

Portland Hoffa and the Alley residents will be there including Kenny Delmar, the announcer, in his famous characterization of "Senator Claghorn"; Minerva Pious as "Mrs. Nussbaum"; Alan Reed as "Falstaff Openshaw"; and Parker Fennelly as "Titus Moody."

Raymond Massey will star on

the "Harvest of Stars" program, which can be heard at 1 p. m. Sunday over NBC, featuring fabulous Tin Pan alley and the Metropolitan Opera star, Mona Paulee, singing American popular songs.

In a dramatic sketch, Massey will play the role of Harry Armstrong, one of the early "greats" of the legendary "Alley." Armstrong is the man who wrote a song he couldn't sell until he plugged it with a barbershop quartet. The number was "Sweet Adeline."

Children Admit They Fired Home

PHOENIX, Ariz., June 22 — (UP) — An 11-year-old girl today calmly told sheriff's deputies that she and her brother and sister, six and nine respectively, burned down the family home in hope it would cause separation of their 40-year-old mother and 64-year-old stepfather.

"He fought with mom all the time," the child said. "So we talked it over and while mom was at work started fires all over the house."

The dwelling in a Phoenix suburb was destroyed despite efforts of the stepfather to extinguish eight widely-separated blazes.

An Arizona law prohibits officers from disclosing names of child offenders unless they face charges in court. The children were turned over to juvenile authorities pending further investigation.

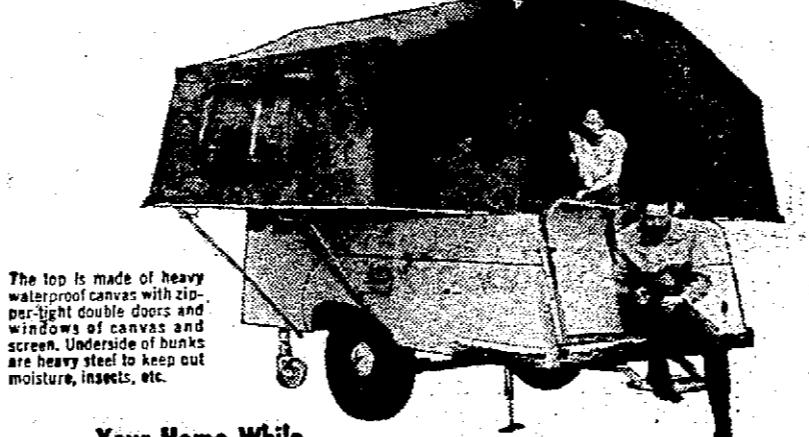

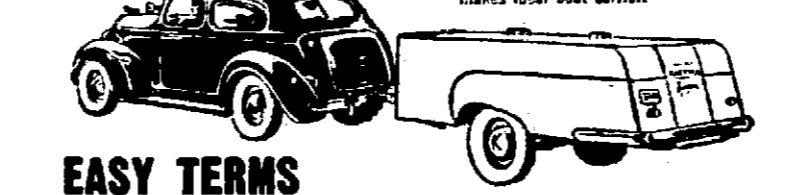
