

'Joe Palooka, Champ' Due At Quilna Theatre Friday

PEORIA, Ill., June 28—(AP)—James Martin Suddeth, 98-year-old veteran of the Civil and Spanish-American Wars, became a bridegroom for the fifth time yesterday.

"But we've been talking marriage ever since," Suddeth said after the marriage ceremony by Peoria Judge Francis C. Vonachen. It was the third marriage for Mrs. Clawson, mother of seven children, two of whom are living.

After the wedding, the couple went to Suddeth's home in nearby Oak Hill, where they entertained neighbors at a reception last night. Suddeth has two sons.

War Is Blamed On Dictatorship

NUERNBERG, June 28—(AP)—Hans Fritzsche, Nazi editor and propagandist, told the international military tribunal today that the "catastrophe" of the Second World War "would have been impossible if there had been some kind of democratic control in Germany."

Fritzsche said he was convinced that the dictatorship form of government contributed directly to the magnitude of the horror that hit Europe.

"Democratic control, even limited, would have made such a catastrophe impossible," the defendant said.

The man who sought to split the Allies by radio propaganda during the war declared he hopes today they remain united, because "Germany would be the first victim of any conflict."

The defense introduced a statement from Gen. Kurt Dittmar, official radio commentator for the high command saying he was able to maintain a critical attitude in his broadcasts "due to the approval and protection of Fritzsche."

Toledo Workers Threaten Strike

TOLEDO, June 28—(INS)—Threats of a strike by Toledo city employees were reported today after council's committee of the whole voted a 36 per cent living-cost index wage adjustment for municipal workers.

The salary committee recommendation was voted out by a 5 to 4 margin.

Following the council session, Harry Card, president of Local 20, AFL-Teamsters Joint Council, told newsmen that some city employees "just might not report for work Monday, but come to council instead."
