Doctor Reports Al Capone Is 'Very Sick Man'

MIAMI BEACH, Fla., June 29.—(UP)—Al Capone, former Chicago gangland chief, is still in his Miami Beach home and is "completely incapable" of conducting any business, his physician revealed today.

The physician, Dr. Kenneth Phillips, said that the 47-year-old Capone is still suffering from the nervous ailment which forced him into seclusion after his release from Alcatraz prison, where he served an income tax evasion sentence.

"Capone's physical and nervous condition remains essentially the same as when last officially reported," Dr. Phillips said. "He is still nervous and excitable and is advised against assuming any responsibility or engaging in any work or business activity."

Charges had been made in Chicago that Capone and his old associates were attempting to gain control of the racing news business.

Dr. Phillips refuted reports from sources near the Capone family that "Scarface Al" had gone to his brother's estate near Mercer, Wis. He said, however, that he had not seen Capone for several weeks.

Bituminous Coal Production Drops

WASHINGTON, June 29.—(INS)—Bituminous coal production dropped slightly below the 12,000,000-ton mark during the week ended June 22, but continued at a rate above a year ago.

The National Coal-assn reported today that the week's production amounted to 11,860,000 net tons, compared with 11,614,000 in the corresponding week of 1945.

However, the figure was a decline from the previous two weeks. Production totaled 12,140,000 tons in the week ended June 15 and 12,780,000 in the week ended June 18.

Production for the year thru June 22 totaled 222,270,000 tons, 22.2 per cent under the 85,665,000-ton production in the same period of last year.

List 15 Slain In Civil Fights

ATHENS, June 29.—(INS)—Government sources reported today that 15 Greek policemen have been killed in civil battle against a band of alleged Communists.

The latest outbreak occurred near Lamia, in Central Greece. In recent days the government has announced a number of similar outbreaks and has charged that Greek Communists were attempting to prevent the monarchy referendum scheduled for Sept. 1.

Girl's Mentality Hit In Murder Hearing

TOLEDO, June 29.—(INS)—State's attorneys presented additional witnesses today against 17-year-old Ethel Mae Burks, on trial for her life in connection with the Apr. 19 death of Mrs. Mary Shulman, former Lima resident and the wife of a prominent Toledo businessman.

A jury of 11 men and one woman heard the testimony in common pleas court.

The defendant was described yesterday by her defense counsel as "an imbecile, incapable of knowing right from wrong" during opening statements.

Mrs. Burks has pleaded innocent by reason of insanity. The state charges that the girl beat Mrs. Shulman to death with a pipe.

RAIL NAP PROVES FATAL

NEW PHILADELPHIA, June 29.—(INS)—A nap on the Pennsylvania railroad tracks was blamed by Coroner D. M. Cera-mella today for the death of Lee McCoy, 51-year-old Negro war veteran. McCoy was fatally injured at Newcomerstown when a train severed both his legs. The coroner said he apparently had fallen asleep with his legs across the rails.
