

Basil Rathbone To Play Role Of Sleuth in Sigma Mystery

Regarded by theatre-goers as the typical complacent-sleuth-type, Basil Rathbone, as Sherlock Holmes, again comes up with the answer to the mystery of "Dressed to Kill," which opens Wednesday at the Sigma theatre.

A treat for those who enjoy the Conan Doyle series, the picture features Nigel Bruce as the pipe-smoking "Doctor Watson," Holmes' able assistant. "Mysterious Intruder," with Richard Dix and Barton MacLane, is an added attraction. The old story of twin sisters as unlike as the sun and moon is well illustrated in the new film, "The Stolen Life," currently showing at the Ohio theatre. Based on a novel by Karel L. Benes, the picture is an unusual story of life with conflict and rivalry in the lives and Kate and Pat Bosworth. Bette Davis plays both parts.

Sonny Tufts and his wife, Barbara, are denying divorce rumors again. "We have a little argument

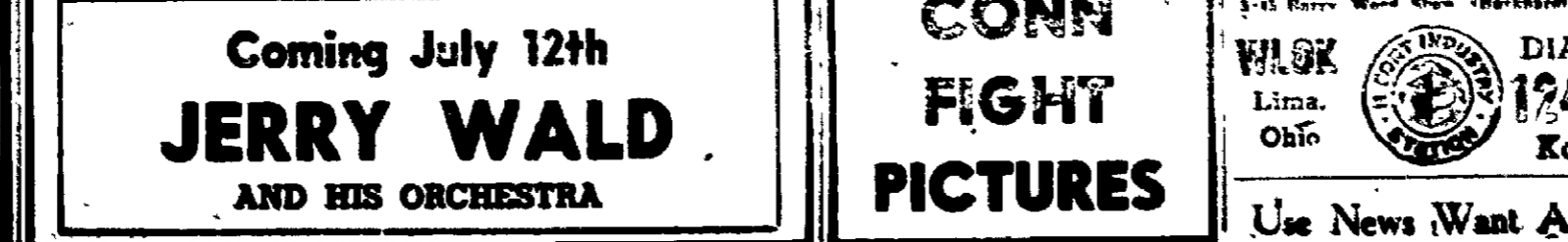
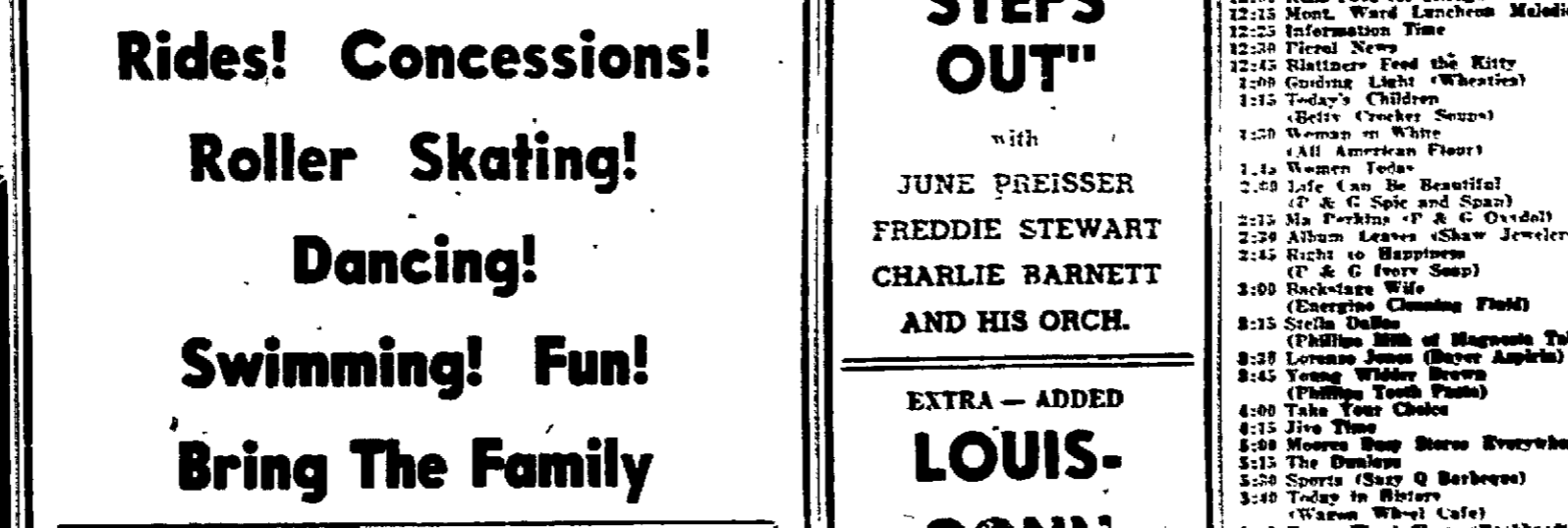
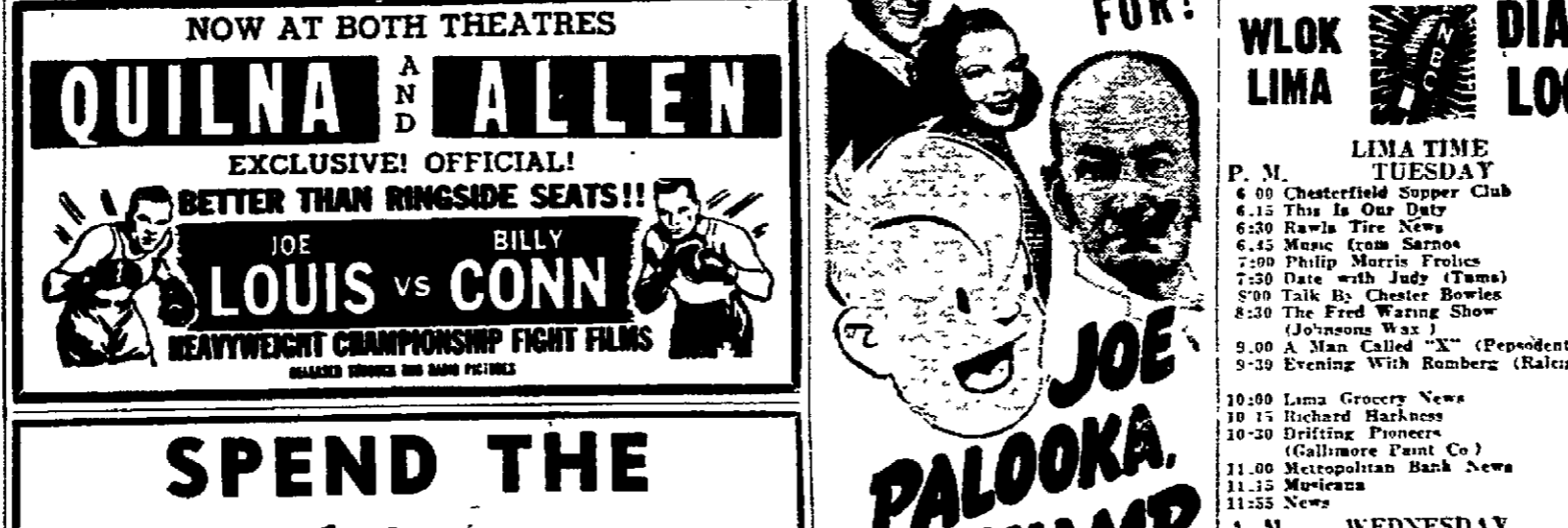
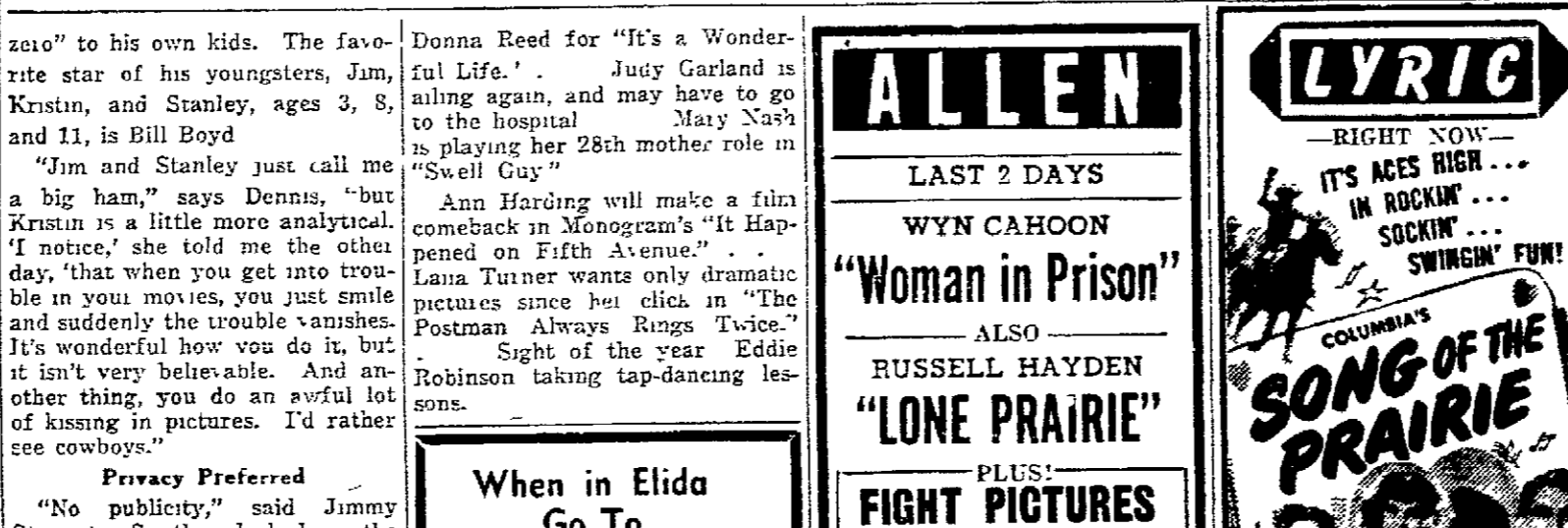

The question of rebirth of Fascism in Spain and the alleged harboring of Axis fugitives in that country, a matter holding high priority on the United Nations Security Council agenda, will form the basis of the discussion entitled "What Should We Do About Spain?" on the broadcast of "American Forum of the Air" at 8:30 p. m. Tuesday over MBS.

Alexander H. Uhl, foreign editor of the newspaper "P. M.," John Vincent Hinkel, director of publicity at the University of Notre Dame and former New York Times correspondent in Europe, Dr. Joseph F. Thorning, authority on Spanish history and culture and Johannes Stekel, well known radio commentator, will participate in the discussion.
