Humphrey Bogart, Sydney Greenstreet and Mary Astor will play their original roles in the screen mystery classic, "The Maltese Falcon," when radio's Academy Award theatre launches its new series on a new day and hour, 9 p. m. Wednesday over CBS.

Bogart as the private sleuth, Sam Spade, becomes involved in a search for a golden falcon encrusted with rare, precious jewels.

GOP Committeemen Oppose Old Age Dole



WASHINGTON, July 3—(UP)—Republican members of the house ways and means committee today voiced strong opposition to a plan to double the federal grant for old age and blind benefits in 11 states.

The proposed increase was recommended yesterday by the full committee when it reported out the social security bill.

Under the measure, the federal government would put up two dollars for every dollar collected by poorer states for old age and blind benefits. Other states would continue to receive only one federal dollar for each they collected.
