

Drama, Mystery Will Invade Local Screens on Saturday

Drama of the highest type and shocking mystery invade the local screens Saturday to add to the enjoyment of those movie fans who gain pleasure from a touch of pathos or the superstitious twist in motion pictures.

One exception, tho, is the double feature billing at the Sigma theatre, "Heartbeat" with Ginger Rogers and Jean Pierre Aumont is the gay story of a Parisian orphan girl looking for a job that will enable her to save enough money to finance a fiancé. Basil Rathbone and Adolphe Menjou have major roles. Francis Langford is started as "The Bamboo Blonde" in a gay, lighthearted adventure of a night club chanteuse.

"Of Human Bondage," W. Somerset Maugham's greatest best-seller novel, comes to the screen at the Ohio theatre, bringing to life those immortal Maugham characters. "Mildred," the author's Cockney character, a hateful but alluring girl is played by Eleanor Parker. Discovered by a talent scout in Ohio, Eleanor is chasing her first top-notch movie role. Paul Henreid plays the sensitive art student overcome by her magnetism.

"House of Horrors," with Rondo Hatton as "the Creeper," hangs over Saturday at the State theatre to scare the wits out of fans. Truly, it's one of those "If-You-Haven't-a-Good-Heart, Don't-See-This" pictures. "Breakfast in Hollywood" also is playing.

Mark Stevens, new Hollywood discovery, assumes a dramatic role in "The Dark Corner," which

opened Friday at the Quilna theatre. A murder-mystery, Lucille Ball, Bill Bendix and Clifton Webb, the story has a complicated plot which unravels itself scene by scene. "Rainbow Over Texas" with Roy Rogers is the second feature.

Not classed as drama, but more of the mystery and western type films, "Gay Cavalier" and "Dangerous Partners" will beckon theatre-goers to the Lyric theatre midnight show Saturday.

The Allen theatre will open Sunday with "Ride, Ranger, Ride," with Gene Autry, and "Road to Alcatraz," with Robert Lowery. "Sudan" and "National Barn Dance" are now playing at the Majestic theatre, with Sunday the final day for their running.

A double feature program for your enjoyment at the Lima Drive-In theatre is "Nevada" and "She's a Sweetheart." The Gloria Drive-In theatre has "Back to Bataan" with John Wayne and Julia Bishop.

Your GI Rights QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS ON SERVICEMEN'S PROBLEMS

By DOUGLAS LARSEN WASHINGTON, July 13—(NEA)—Veterans organizations are working hard to get the bill which would give terminal pay to enlisted men enacted this summer. The House has already approved it. It is up to the Senate to act now.

There are rumors that the Senate will recommend a flat sum, such as \$400, for every veteran who is a former enlisted man. This would save the tremendous bookkeeping cost of trying to figure what is really due each man. The terminal-leave bill which passed the House would let each veteran submit a sworn affidavit as to how much leave was due him when he left the service. He would be paid at the rate he was receiving when discharged, including allowances and longevity.

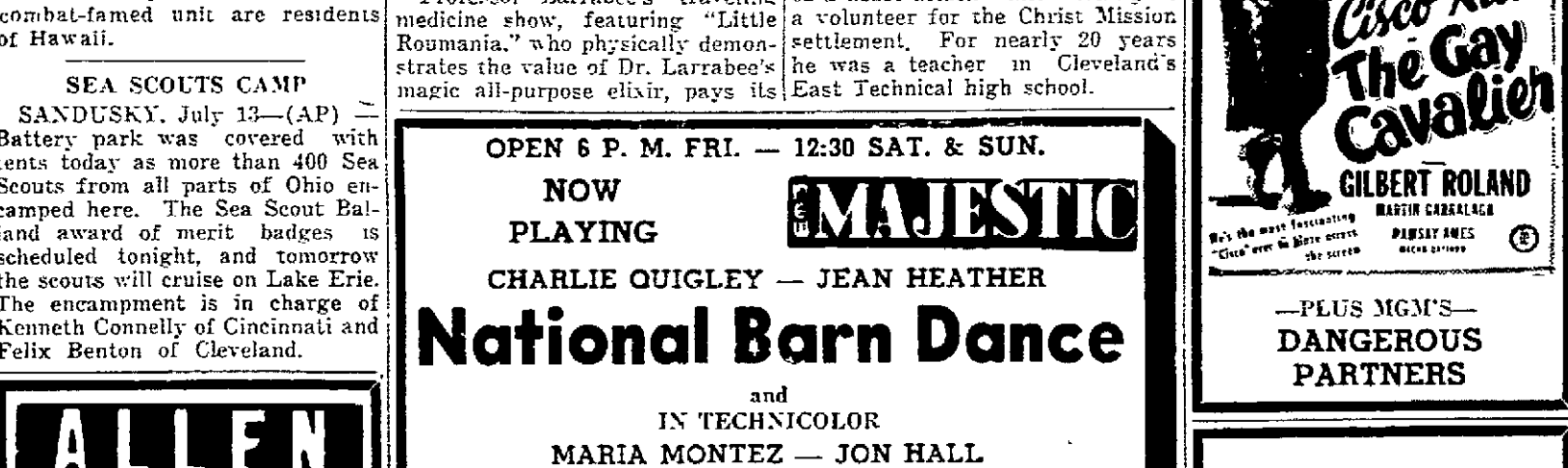
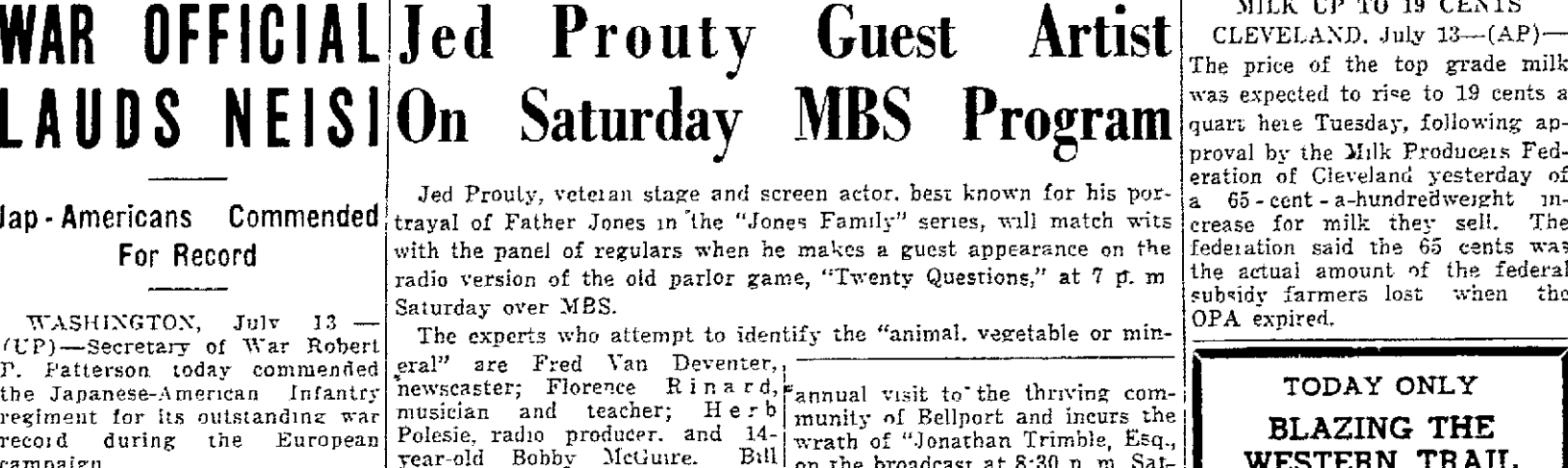
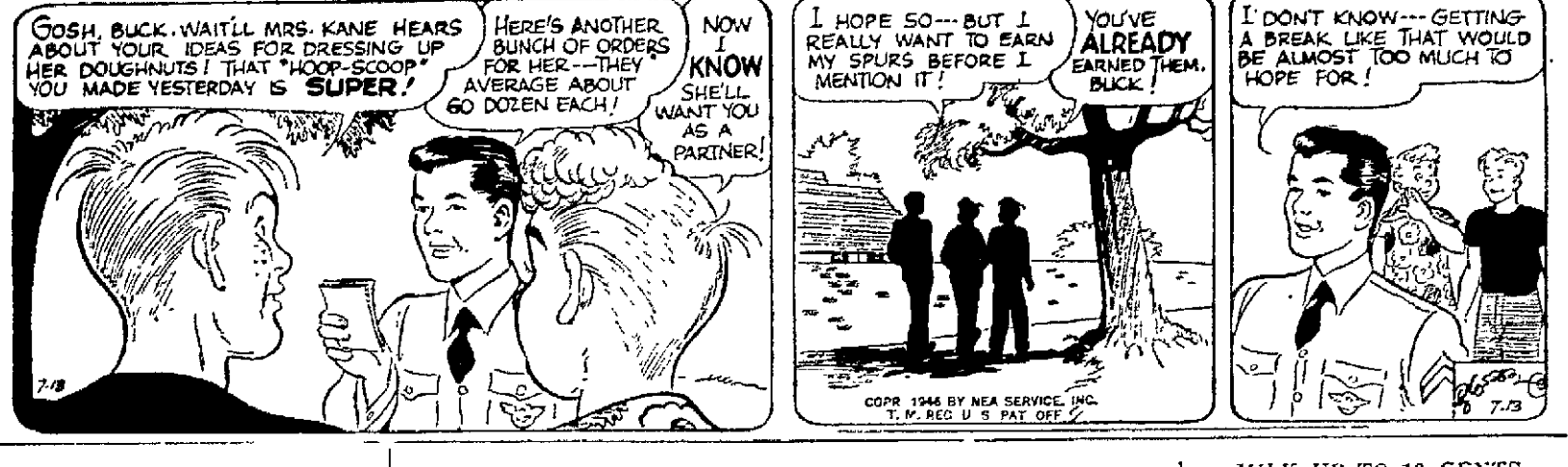
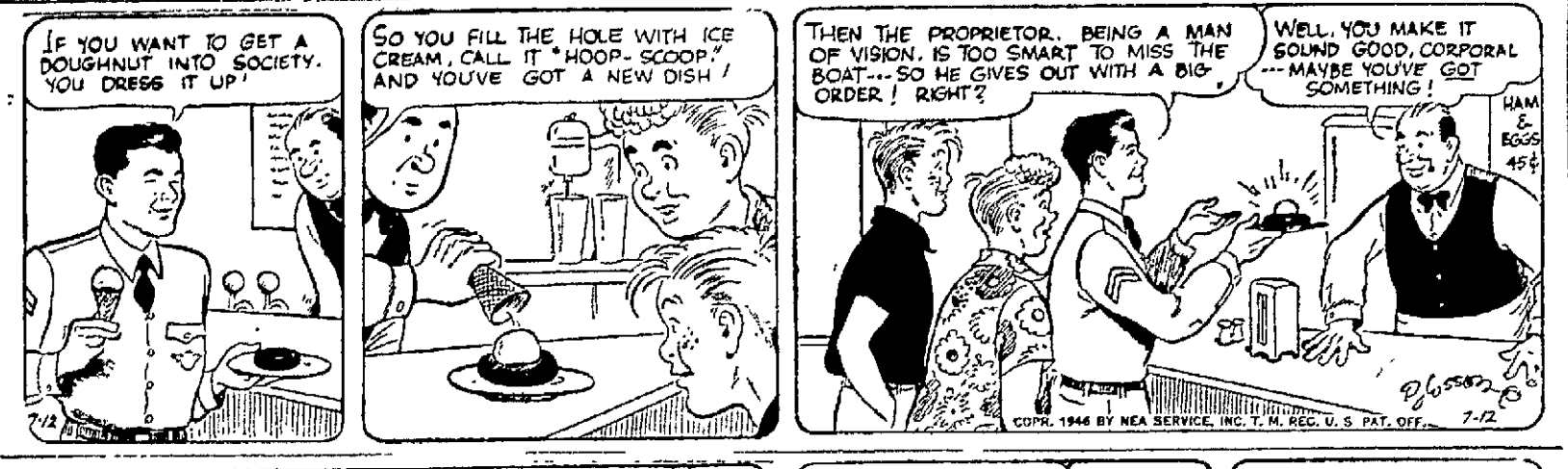
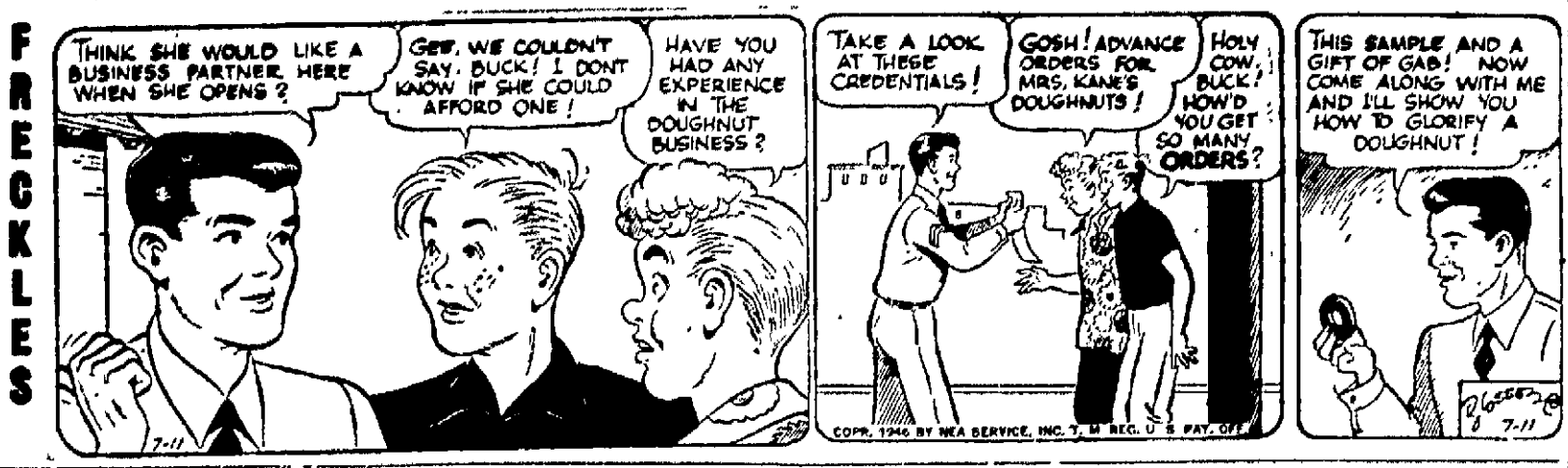
The House bill assumes that each man is entitled to two and one-half days of leave for every month of service. The maximum any veteran could claim would be ungranted leave for 120 days.

There are various estimates as to how much this would cost the government. Experts agree it would probably cost more than \$3,000,000,000.

In many cases no records were kept of the amount of leave given an enlisted man. It is expected that three-day passes and 48-hour passes would not be counted as regular leave.

It would probably take years before the government would be able to audit the veterans' affidavits. And then probably a spot check would be made.

Many veterans who were discharged soon after V-J Day will have no leave pay coming to them. They received 30-day furloughs, and many got an additional 15 days after that.

FRANKFURT, July 13—(UP)—American headquarters today said that Col. Lester A. Webb, 50, Macon, Ga., will be tried later this month on a charge of attempting to smuggle \$12,000 in gold across the Swiss border into France.

Webb was apprehended May 7 by Swiss customs guards on route to France and the United States. Army spokesmen said the Swiss reported he had six solid gold bars, 670 gold coins and 75 watches.
