

Cinema Menu Spotted with Mystery, Drama

Famous Book Remade Into Fine Movie

Chinese Reds Mass In Hopon Province

NANKING, July 13—(AP)—The Chinese press reported today that Communist troops which have been massing in Hopon province had launched their initial attack against government outposts of Tientsin and had struck at a government garrison on the Peiping-Mukden railroad.

Meanwhile, as U. S. Envoy General George Marshall renewed ac-

tive effort to negotiate peace between the two elements, military sources at Mukden reported that the rival Communist and government Manchurian field commanders had agreed to hold their much-delayed peace meeting tomorrow at Changchun.
