## PAC Group Loses Tax Exemption

NEW YORK, July 15 (AP)—The Political Action Committee for Palestine, Inc., announced tonight its tax exempt status had been revoked by Internal Revenue Commissioner Joseph D. Nunan.

Nunan confirmed the action and explained the committee's recent insertion in newspapers of an advertisement against the loan made the committee "no longer qualified for the exemption under the internal revenue law" as a charitable and educational organization.

"Once an organization becomes a political pressure group it is not entitled to the exemption, and that goes for any organization," Nunan said.
