The Common Council of the City of Madison do ordain as follows:
1. Subsection (a) of Section 181 of the Madison City Ordinance entitled "Plan of Madison and Map" are hereby amended to read as follows:
(a) The following described property is hereby zoned Commercial "A" District:
Lots One (1), Two (2) and three (3), Block 12, of Shepard Park and the following described property:
Beginning at the point of intersection of the West line of Franklin Avenue and the South line of University Avenue; thence South 88 feet to the West line of University Avenue; thence West 120 feet to a line parallel to the South line of University Avenue; thence Easterly 120 feet along the South line of University Avenue to the point of beginning.
(b) The following described property is hereby zoned Residential "A" District:
Lots Eight (8) to Nineteen (19), inclusive, Shepard Park; Lots One (1) to Six (6), inclusive, of Block Three (3) Shepard Park.
(c) There shall be in effect from and after its passage and publication and in accordance with the provisions of Section 181 of the Ordinances of the City of Madison.
