

New Quilna Film Scheduled To Open Engagement Friday

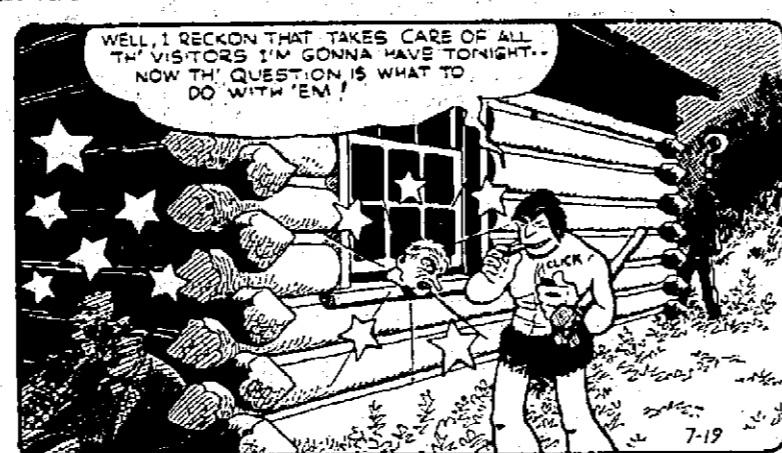
