Your GI Rights QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS ON SERVICEMEN'S PROBLEMS

By DOUGLAS LARSEN WASHINGTON, July 15 (NEA)—Here, with other unusual queries, is a question from a veteran who wants to do the right thing by the Veterans' Administration. Q—I am a veteran. I bought a house under the GI-loan plan. I was wounded during the war, and was discharged with a disability. I am using the disability pension money I get from the government to pay off the loan. But I understand that veterans who do this are exempted from paying taxes. Is this true? How do I apply for this tax exemption? A—There is nothing on the federal statute books which exempts veterans from state or local property taxes. An individual city or state might, however, provide for this exemption. Ask the city clerk in your town about it. Q—While I was stationed in Australia I fell in love. We became engaged. I kept sending her money all the time I was in service so that she would be able to pay her passage to America. Last week I got a letter from her saying that she had changed her mind and didn't love me anymore. Is there any way I can get back the money I sent to her? A—That's a tough one. The chances are you can't do much about it. The State Department might be able to help you. Q—Since I was discharged my disability has gotten worse. Can I get my pension increased? A—Yes. Apply to the nearest VA office for a review of your case. (Questions will be answered only in this space—not by mail.)

NEW LEXINGTON, July 20—(AP)—Edward McKnight, 32, of nearby Shawnee, was in Perry-co jail today awaiting a date for trial on a first degree murder charge in connection with the shooting in early June of Luther Browning, 19, also of Shawnee. McKnight had been under observation at Lima State hospital for 20 days following his indictment by a Perry-co grand jury, but Lima psychiatrists reported no basis for his plea of insanity.

The will asked that Mrs. Donahy distribute among the children the personal effects of the three-time Ohio governor. One clause in the will expressed the hope "that my sons and daughters will always be loyal to my widow, their country and themselves."
