

'So Goes My Love' Starts At Sigma Theatre Saturday

Few pictures since "Going My Way" carry the heart-warming emotion of "So Goes My Love," the new Myrna Loy-Don Ameche film scheduled to open at the Sigma theatre Saturday.

The film tells the story of Hiram Maxim, an inventor, who meets a girl quite by accident, marries her and has children. Myrna-Loy and Don Ameche are co-stars for the first time in this fine film. Miss Loy, who devoted most of the war years to Red Cross work, is back on the screen and she really clicks with an adult performance worthy of Academy consideration. Ameche again proves that he can play practically anything thrown in his lap.

"The Green Years" at the Ohio has a story to tell that will not soon be forgotten. Tom Drake, Charles Coburn, Beverly Tyler and Hume Cronyn have the leading roles in the film which tells of an Irish youngster who is forced by circumstances to come to Scotland to live with his grandparents. It is a deeply touching film with the humor that was to be found only in the book.

Vincent Price and Lynn Bari the leading roles in "Shock," the film currently showing at the Quilna theatre. Price has the role of a doctor and Miss Bari, his assistant. The story tells of an amnesia-shock victim and of a murder. Their connections prove both interesting and mysterious.

Joel McCrea turns in another of his outstanding performances in "The Virginian," now showing at the State theatre. The film is the story of the old west before any written laws. McCrea is joined on the acting roster by Sonny Tufts, Brian Donley and Barbara Britton, all of whom give praiseworthy performances.

James Craig and Frances Gifford are the stars of "She Went To The Races," the hilarious film now showing at the Lyric theatre. Sharing the bill is "Captain Tugboat Annie."

Opening at the Allen theatre, Wednesday will be "Alaska" and "Death Rides the Plains." Currently playing at the theatre are "Tiger Woman" and "Devil's Trail" with Tex Ritter and Wild Bill Elliott.

Loretta Young and Alan Ladd have the leading roles in "Beyond Tomorrow" the story of a deaf girl whose hearing is restored. Ladd has the role of the doctor who performs the miracle that no other doctor can, but, as is the usual case, is scorned following a slight upset of her physical being. Sharing the billing at the Drive-In theatre is "My Name Is Julia Ross." Both pictures open Wednesday at "Beside Manner" opens at the Gloria Drive-In.

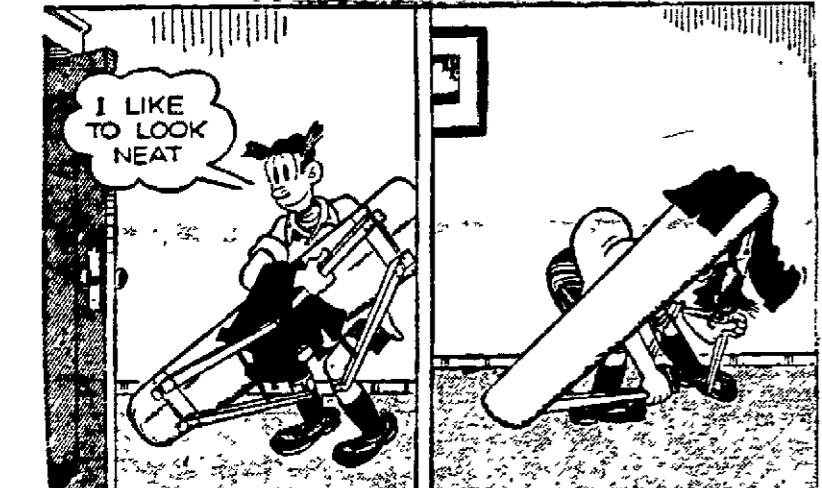

Cleveland Firm Offering Stock

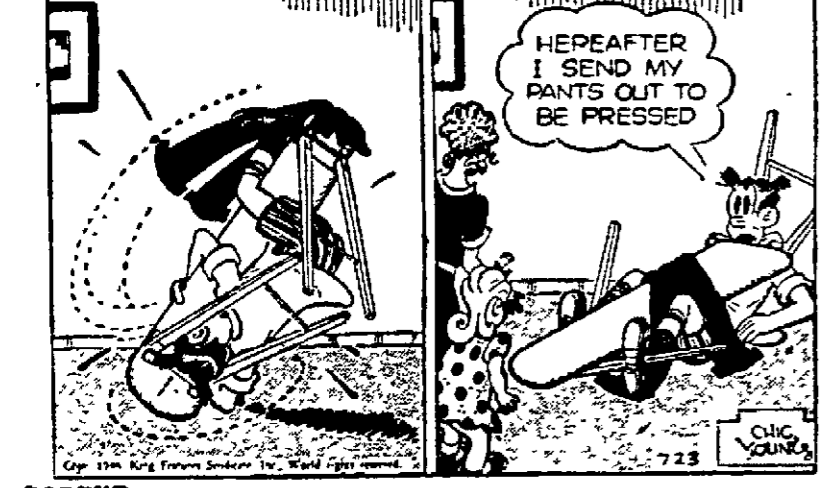

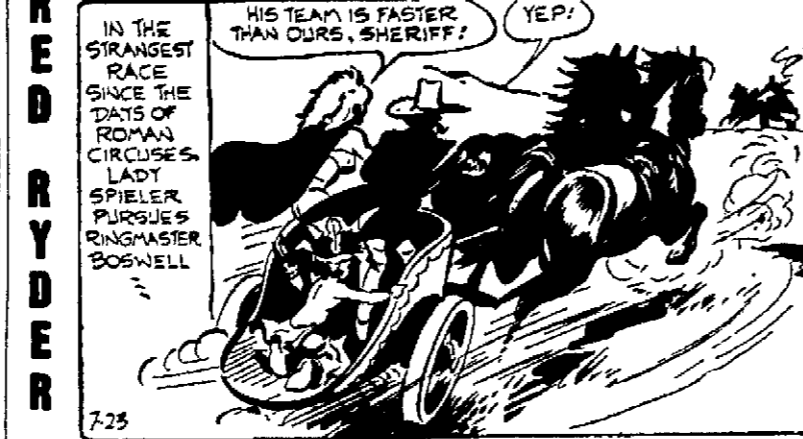

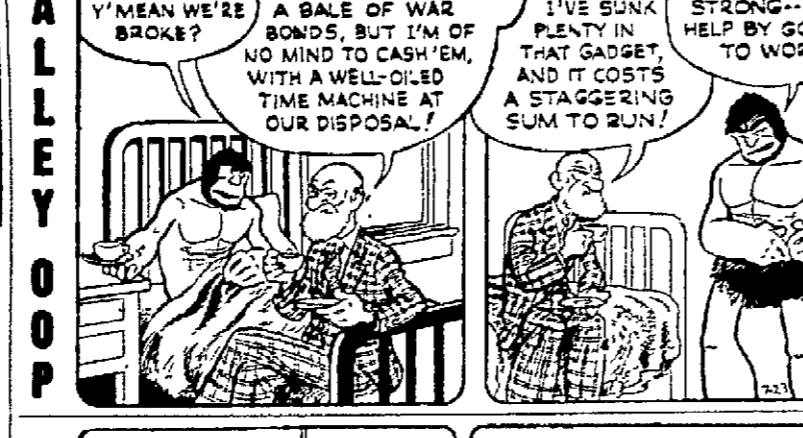

'The Arm' Says Old Egyptian Trick Is Better Body Builder

HOLLYWOOD, July 23—(UP)—Hollywood's answer to "Mr. America"—a 240-pound actor of sorts—today flexed the world's biggest bicep and challenged the champ, muscle for muscle.

Furthermore, he doesn't think much of the muscle-man's body-building routine. Says it doesn't leave him any time to take advantage of his physique.

Moveland's body beautiful is 30-year-old Bob Brown, an ex-Marine. And he claims he's got as much—and more—of what made 22-year-old Alan Stephan, America's No. 1 Man. Not for nothing does Brown call himself "The Arm."

"This Stephan," he said, "claims he weighs 240—and 63 per cent of it's muscle. Well, I weigh 240 and 71 per cent of it is muscle. Look, 'The Arm' stripped off his shirt, rolled up his fists, and let the muscles ripple along his arms.

"And believe me," he went on, "I make better use of it than he does. When they talk about me having a girl on each arm they're not kidding."

Stephan became Mr. America two weeks ago in Detroit at the AAU's version of a beauty contest. The judges took one look at his 50-inch chest and 18-inch bicep and hesitated no longer.

Brown isn't impressed. His chest stretches the tape out to 51. And his biceps measures 19 1/2.

Stephan says he exercises before breakfast every morning—lightly. After dinner he spends several hours standing on his hands, lifting bar bells, and tumbling.

Brown says that's a waste of time. "Valuable time," he adds, "that you could use on a date—impressing some sweet thing with your muscles."

Now take him. He makes with the exercise stuff only one hour—every other day. Thanks, he says, to the old Egyptian muscle men.

"Three years ago when I got out of the Marines I was a skinny runt," Brown said. "I weighed 123 pounds. I had malaria sinusitis. Picked it up in the South Pacific. And the doctors gave me six months to live."

Then one day he bumped into two Egyptologists who told him about some rope-pulling exercises they'd discovered in the pyramids.

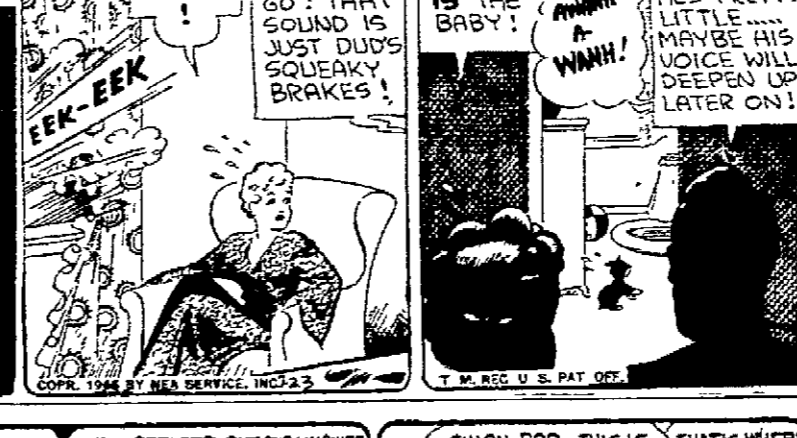
