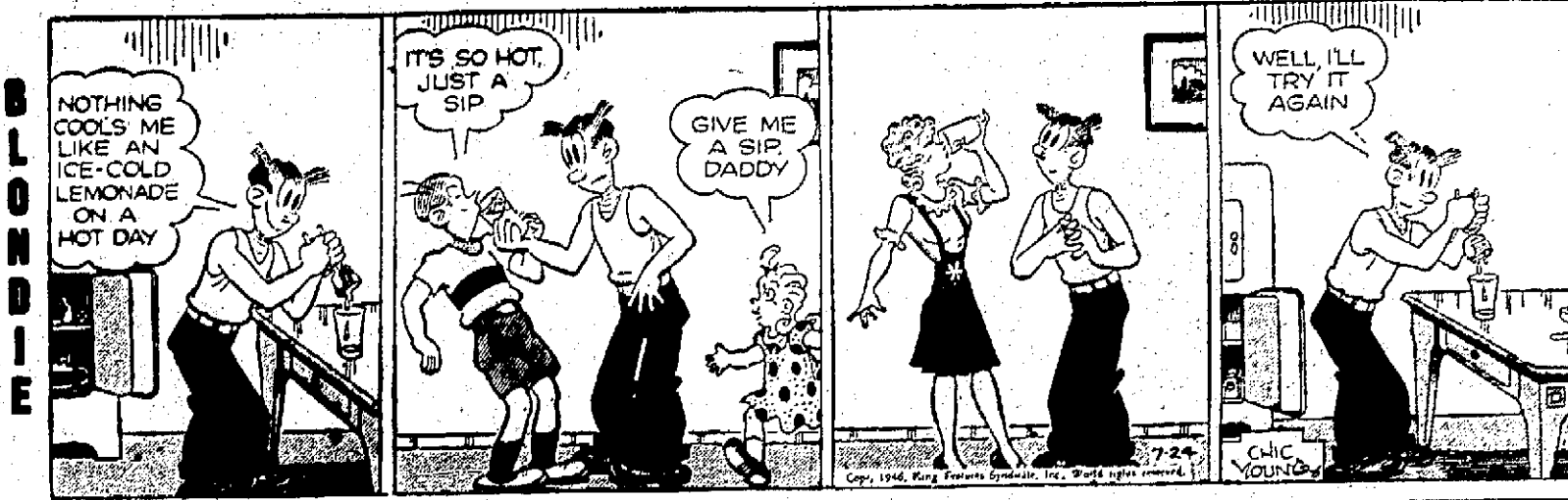

# Elaborate Plans Are Made For Broadcast of Bomb Test

Broadcast of the second Bikini bomb test, set for Wednesday, should show improved reception over that of the June 30 blast. In cooperation with the Army and Navy, NBC announces it will have an elaborate relay system in operation.

Four shortwave circuits are to be used. Time of the principal broadcast, a 15-minute description of the underwater test, is scheduled for 4:30 p. m. on all networks by pool arrangements. First results of the trial are to be given by CBS at 6:45 p. m. and 10 p. m. by NBC at 6 p. m. and 10 p. m., and MBS at 9 p. m.
