

'To Each His Own' Opening At Ohio Theatre Friday

\$250,000 Trust Is Bequeathed To Faithful Aid

CLEVELAND, July 25.—(INS)—For her devoted service and companionship, an elderly suburban Cleveland Heights woman today was the recipient of a trust fund set up by her former employer.

Miss Alina A. Morton, in her 60's, was rewarded by the late Miss Mary H. Severance, member of a prominent Cleveland family. First employed by Miss Severance over 20 years ago, Miss Morton made many trips to the Orient, Middle East and Europe with her employer.

Miss Severance, who died Apr. 16 at the age of 80, bequeathed her former companion and servant \$5,000 cash plus the proceeds from the trust which will bring her \$4,800 annually.
