

CAMPAIGN FEVER HITS ROMANIA AS VOTE NEARS

Government, Opposition Chiefs Shift Their Election Policies

BUCHAREST, July 27—(AP)—Although the actual date for the Romanian elections has not been set, electioneering fever already is sweeping the country.

As was to be expected, the government got off to a flying start with communications, press and radio at its disposal.

Both government members and opposition leaders are eager to have foreign correspondents with them on their campaign tours.

Government members are making official and solemn distribution of the titles, and with each deed goes an election speech.

Tenbani (Teo) Georgescu, Communist minister of the interior, recently distributed property deeds to some 21,000 peasants at Contesti in the rich Dambovitza district.

Several lessons were learned from the meeting. The peasants are very reserved, listen to the government speeches in silence.

The distribution of the property title deeds, however, draws an eager response. Thousands met the speakers platform to clutch the gaudily colored prints.

But the peasants mainly are governed by local political or economic interests. These and the fame of individual candidates will count more in most election districts than the massed persuasion of party propaganda machinery.

Georgescu's speeches follow Communist party lines. He promises free and unfettered elections and no tampering with ballots and says that this election will be the first really free vote ever held in Romania.

He lambastes local soap box orators by urging more radical reforms by reminding them that the Communist party is not out to destroy capitalism in Romania and adds that "democratic" capitalist forces will be welcome if they want to cooperate in Romania's reconstruction.

It remains to be proved to what extent Communist doctrine is reconcilable with the interests of the middle classes, the landed gentry and the more conservative section of the Romanian peasants.

Until now, the government has tried to postpone the balloting until after the harvests are complete. Premier Groza himself said that he prefers to appeal to a full stomach rather than to an empty one.

The government, with an eye on the foreign ministers in Paris, has been eager to determine which way the wind is blowing before making final decisions.

The opposition (Maniu and Bratianu) parties see in the possibilities of an early Romanian peace settlement the chance of holding elections without Russian troops in the country.

Convict Quits Threat to Kill Self in Prison

RUTLEDGE, Tenn., July 27—(AP)—A 31-year-old escaped inmate convict, who threatened to remove himself from his jail here, gave up his 24-hour defiance today.

He handed his gun over to a deputy sheriff and then collapsed, apparently from nervous exhaustion.

Threats of the use of tear gas at first failed to make the prisoner, Louis Lockhart, give up his .32 calibre pistol.

The Granger-co jail was cleared with the exception of one or two witnesses.

Then Lockhart asked for five minutes "to think it over."

Finally he asked permission to write a note to his 25-year-old wife. He wrote a few words, then handed the gun to Deputy Sheriff H. M. Clifton, burst into tears and collapsed.
