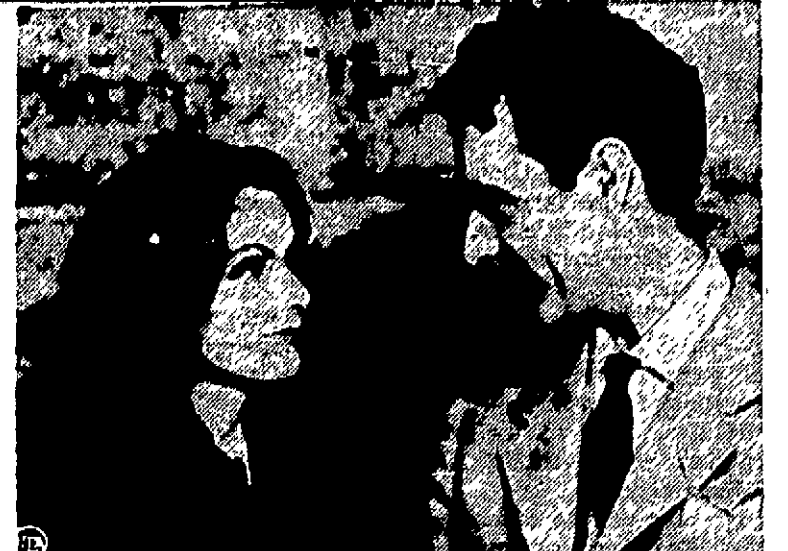

Hollywood Calls Talkie Era That of 'Great Invasion'

By ERSKINE JOHNSON HOLLYWOOD, July 30—(NEA)—When the talkie ushered in a revolution in movies some 20 years ago, it started also what Hollywood still recalls as The Great Invasion.

From girlie-girlie shows and grand opera, Shakespearean stage and the grimier fringes of vaudeville and music hall there swarmed into the movie industry, in the late twenties and earliest thirties, entertainers of every ilk. They soon actually outnumbered established screen stars and leading players.

So there was a time when three actors were bidding for every job, and more often than not, the newcomer got it. Producers tended to favor them over the old-timers, because early talkies were virtually stage presentations photographed from a spectator's seat in the theatre.

Talkie cameras in their huge, sound-proof booths couldn't move around like silent cameras. There were a few silent screen favorites who were sacrificed immediately. Ray Griffith and John Gilbert, top favorites at the time, were among them because their voices wouldn't do for talkies.

Relatively obscure Conrad Nagel, on the other hand, who had an ideal early-talkie voice, quickly became the busiest star in the new medium.

Foreign stars such as Garbo and Emil Jannings, at their zenith when the talkie arrived, frantically began to improve their English diction. To this day movie sound men say "M.O.S." when they mean a silent shot, a saying which became part of movie jargon when a certain foreign filmite said his preferred pictures "mitt out sound."

Warner Brothers' second Jolson picture, "The Singing Fool," grossed twice as much as the first one's two million, so with a head start, the Brothers were able to get such stars as Pauline Frederick, Ruth Chatterton and John Barrymore on long-term contract.

One of the earliest talkie dramas was "On Trial," starring Miss Frederick. They also launched huge musical spectacles, and were quickly followed in this by other studios.
