## Your GI Rights

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS ON SERVICEMEN'S PROBLEMS

WASHINGTON, Aug. 2—(NEA)—The symbol of every veteran of World War II, the Unknown Soldier, will soon be brought back to America and rest in permanent glory. Congress has passed a bill which provides for the selection and return of an unknown serviceman. The War Department is working out the details.

This unknown soldier, sailor, marine, or coast guardman will be placed beside the Unknown Soldier of World War I in Arlington National cemetery, according to present plans.

The method of selecting the fallen hero has not been definitely set.

After the last war the bodies of four unknown soldiers were exhumed from different military cemeteries in France. Since unknowns were identified by number only, the numbers were selected at random. After the four bodies were exhumed, all records of their numbers, the plots in which they were buried, and the cemeteries from which they came were destroyed.

Each of the four exhumed bodies was placed in a steel gray casket in a small room in the city hall of Chalons-sur-Marne.

On Oct. 24, 1921, after thousands of French people had visited the small room, a sergeant of the occupation force was chosen to make the selection. He passed three times around the four caskets and then placed a bouquet of flowers upon one, signifying that it was his selection.

The casket was carried across the Atlantic in the "Olympia," flagship of Admiral Dewey. It was brought to Washington and laid in state inside the Capitol grounds, on the catafalque where only martyred presidents—Lincoln, Garfield, and McKinley—had rested before.

In an impressive ceremony, the Unknown Soldier was taken to his final resting place at Arlington, across the river, on Nov. 11, 1921.

Final tribute was paid when President Harding pinned the Medal of Honor and the Distinguished Service Cross on the casket. Officials of various foreign countries also placed the highest honors of their nations on the casket.

## 2 Children Killed As Fire Hits Home

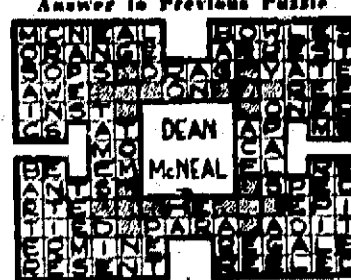
CINCINNATI, Aug. 2—(AP)—Two children suffocated early today as fire swept their home, Night Police Chief George Peary reported.

# Lima Grads, Returning Vets Have Best Educational Opportunities in Home State

Lima girls and boys graduated from high school or returning veterans making use of the GI Bill of Rights have the best opportunity of any young people in the United States.

There are 46 registered colleges and universities in Ohio—forty-six schools of higher education from which to make the current popular choice of "what college to attend." This number is more than any other single state in the Union.

The colleges range in size from 25 to 22,000 students; from \$500 to \$2,500 a year; from 15 to 300 miles distant from here; from educational to for men or women only; from curriculum in home economics to agriculture and law; from privately endowed institutions to church denominational and state schools.

Never before in the history of the United States has there been such a demand for "learning." A few years back a college graduate was a rarity; today it is almost the accepted.
