

# Hypnotist Has Big Hopes Of Lulling Whole Nation

Ralph Slater, a quiet-mannered man, has a couple of quiet ambitions. First, he hopes to put a federal court jury to sleep. Thereafter, he wants to climb to bigger things and put the whole country to sleep by radio.

A hypnotist heard on MBS a few months ago, Slater has put out a recording designed to induce slumber. Called "Time to Sleep," 23 of the records were seized in Brooklyn by federal authorities who say that the disc comes under the terms of the Food, Drug and Cosmetics Act.

Slater is prepared to argue the point when the case comes up in Brooklyn, Aug. 21. "I'm going to ask for a jury of insomniacs," he said. "They can take the record home and try it out and they'll be put to sleep."

The hypnotist hopes to sell the record to stations all over the country as a sign-off piece, and put sleep on a mass production basis. He hopes to be known as "America's Sandman."

# Consolidations Cut Ohio Rural School Totals

COLUMBUS, Aug. 8.—(INS)—The vanishing "little red schoolhouse" continues to lose ground in Ohio.

The state education department reported today that only 2,134 rural elementary schools will open

next month, 45 less than were in operation a year ago.

"This decrease is due entirely to consolidation within already existing school districts," the report stated.

State Education Director Clyde Hissong said that 196 one-teacher schools have been abandoned by the state during the past five years. He added that 517 schools of that type remain in operation.

Ohio has three general types of schools: city, exempted village and rural. An education department

spokesman pointed out that many rural schools were so small that the trend toward consolidation was in the interest of increased efficiency.

# Tax Drive Nets 170 Millions

WASHINGTON, Aug. 8.—(INS)—The Treasury department announced today that its drive against black market operators and other tax evaders netted \$170,000,000 in the year-ended June 30, 1946.

All of this additional tax money came from voluntary payment of delinquent and amended returns, and included one payment of two

million dollars. Treasury Secretary Snyder refused to name any of the persons or corporations involved.

The treasury also said that in a campaign coordinated with OPA, 85 additional convictions were obtained in the same year in connection with liquor black markets.

The drive also resulted in a sharp reduction of sugar diversion for illicit stills.

The tax bureau announced that for the first time in history, recommended adjustments of pen-

alties and assessments over and above original tax returns would exceed \$1,000,000,000 in the year ended June 30.

Total of these additional sums is \$1,275,000,000.
