

# Theatres Back to Normal After Anniversary Week

With the bustle of the anniversary week past, Lima's theatres return to near normalcy with some more good entertainment for the week-end.

"Canyon Passage" at the Ohio theatre, brings the old west right to movie-goers' front doorstep—figuratively speaking—as it continues its engagement at the theatre. Dana Andrews, Susan Hayward and Brian Donlevy have the leading roles in the film.

"The Return of Rusty," successor to the film, "Adventures of Rusty," puts in its bid to entertain folks this weekend. Ted Donaldson has the leading role in this film of a refugee boy, a dog, and an American boy. Sharing the billing at the Quilna is the swash-buckling story, "The Adventures of Marco Polo," with Gary Cooper. "Night and Day" illustrating the 20-year developments of sound motion pictures and starring Gary Grant and Alexis Smith, is playing for its second big week at the Sigma theatre. Based on the life of the fabulous musical comedy composer, Cole Porter, the movie is a technicolor marvel and a sound milestone.
