

# 'Anna and the King of Siam' At Quilna Theatre on Friday

FRANKFURT, Aug. 16—(INS)—U. S. Third Army headquarters announced today that two GIs have been sentenced to life imprisonment and one to 15 years in custody for going AWOL.

Those given life were Pvt. William Tavarres of New Bedford, Mass., and Pvt. Lawrence A. Stoffer, Norfolk, Neb.

Both men were picked up recently after having been AWOL for more than two years.

The other prisoner is Pvt. Frank J. Gadeon of Parma, O., who was captured during an armed holdup of a motor pool in Lyon, France.

The three men were members of the crack Third Infantry Division during the war.

## Special Patrol To Aid Legion

## Eden Attacks Soviet Methods

WASHINGTON, Aug. 16—(UP)—Russia's methods of trying to gain security may result in a world-wide split between Communist and democratic nations without giving Russia the security she wants, Britain's former foreign secretary Anthony Eden said today.

In an article in Collier's magazine, Eden said Russia is insisting on establishment of friendly governments in neighboring states and had "virtually imposed" Communism in key positions in non-Communist countries.

This, declared Eden, creates a "tendency for alignments to be drawn" between the Soviet and governments of a Communist complexion on one hand and those who believe in a free democracy on the other.
