



Who Is Fainting Now? Phils Tip Dodgers, Reds Beat Cubs

NEW YORK.—(U.P.)—It appeared today that Jim Gallagher, general manager of the Chicago Cubs, hollered wisely but too loudly last week when he squawked that eastern National League teams appeared to go into a faint when they see the Brooklyn Dodgers. Gallagher's point was that the Cardinals and Cubs trim the Dodgers, who thereupon gain back a fat lead by gobbling Boston, the Giants and the Phils—all of whom play well against the Cards and Cubs. Gallagher particularly reproached the Phils, who had been ripped over 12 times in a row by the Dodgers at that time.

The fingers of scorn worked, because the Phils rose up the next day and trounced Brooklyn twice. Friday the Phils, giddy with their new power, licked the Dodgers again, 4-2, snapping a four-game winning streak for Brooklyn.

But Gallagher, who still hopes his Cubs can edge into the pennant, couldn't enjoy the result. The Cincinnati Reds, who used to go into a faint at sight of the Cubs, heard his remarks and took the personal, and whipped Chicago, 3-2.

Lefty Oscar Judd gave the Phils their victory, pitching a four-hit game and batting in a run in an eight-inning rally. Vance Dinges singled and was sacrificed to second. A walk put two on and an infield hit filled the bases. Emil Verban's grounder resulted in a force-out at home, but Catcher Bruce Edwards threw the ball away trying for a doubleplay and a run came home to break a 2-2 tie. Judd then singled another run home. Hugh Casey, third Dodger hurler, was the loser.

One game of the scheduled day-and-night Cardinal-Pirate series was rained out, and at night Ken Heintzelman felled the St. Louis effort to gain a game by notting the Cards on two hits, 3-0. The Dodgers still hold a two-game lead. Elvie Fletcher doubled home two runs, but had to be third after a triple in the eighth inning. The Reds got 13 hits to win. An error, two infield hits, a bunt and a fly gave them the first two tallies, and Ben Zientara's single and Ray Mueller's double provided the third run. Chicago got its runs in the last of the ninth, chasing John Metkeli. Hi Bithorn was the loser.

The Giants and Braves were rained out.

Red Sox Whip Yankees
The Boston Red Sox virtually extinguished any Yankee pennant hopes by beating the second-placers, 4-1, showing New York 13 games behind. Mickey Harris won the route to win, beating Spud Chandler. A Yankee error led to the first Boston run, and the next two scored on successive singles by John Pesky. Ted Williams, Bobby Doerr and Rudy York, who batted in two runs for the day. Joe DiMaggio homered for New York, but had to leave the game with a sore arm after making a throw to third from center field. He may be out several days.

Detroit moved to within two games of second place by trimming Chicago, 3-1, on Virgil Trucks' six-hit pitching. Singles by Dick Wakefield and Roy Cullenbine, a double by Paul Richards and a flyball gave Detroit two runs in the second inning and sent Al Holland to his first defeat after three victories.

Washington - Philadelphia was rained out and the Browns and Indians were not scheduled.

Friday star—Oscar Judd of the Phils, who pitched Brooklyn with four hits, stepped out of many jams, and batted in a run as his team beat the league-leaders, 4-2.
