Looking At HOLLYWOOD with ERSKINE JOHNSON

HOLLYWOOD, Aug. 23—(NEA)—Strolling amid the twinkling poplars at Universal the other day, diligently seeking specimens of the curious Fauna Hollywoodiana, we were startled by a piercing scream that, almost made us drop our butterfly net and fire-ax.

Remember little Sara Swartz? Baby Swartz, that is? The Denver Darling?

Well, frankly, we're no elephant ourselves, but it is a matter of history that when she was a mere tot Sara was "discovered" in Denver by Carl Laemmle, and that she was brought to Hollywood to be the Shirley Temple of her day.

Her specialty is screaming. She has made quite a study of it, and she can tear anything off in that

line from a lady-like cry of fright to an uninhabited block-buster. You don't always SEE her scream, you understand. Most of the time she is dubbed in for a feminine star who either can't scream convincingly or comes too high for the studio to let her risk damaging her vocal chords.

"The scream you heard," Miss Swartz told us in Heister's office, "was my block-buster. It costs \$50. The others I generally let go for \$35. I can do comic screams, tragic screams, all kinds of screams."

"Do you have to keep in training to scream professionally?" we inquired. "Certainly. I never smoke or drink, always eat lightly before performing, and exercise my vocal chords regularly."

"You mean at home before going to bed?" "Heavens, no! I drive out to the hills where I won't get into trouble with the neighbors."

Miss Swartz claims another distinction. She says she has worked in more pictures than anyone else, man or woman, living or dead—2157 over a period of 25 years to date, according to her tally.

Sometimes she actually appears in them as a player, and sometimes she just screams into them, as she's doing for Heister in Walter Wagner's "Smash-Up," in that she'll scream twice, once for Susan Hayward and once for Marsha Hunt.
