French Arrest 55 in Probes

NICE, Aug. 28.—(INS)—Fifty-five persons, including 29 city officials, were arrested in Nice today as result of what police termed "the biggest black market scandal in the history of France."

Laurent Maissa, chief of the Nice food ministry, was among those taken into custody.

During the past two years, it was said, a million and a half francs worth of goods were sold for 150 francs each. The total take was put in the neighborhood of a quarter billion francs.

Building Booms In Single Month

COLUMBUS, Aug. 28.—(UP)—Construction activity in Ohio increased 44 per cent in June from May and more than 400 per cent from June, 1945, the bureau of business research of Ohio State university revealed today.

Building activity figures, based on the value of contracts awarded, showed that residential construction increased 37 per cent during June and public works construction was upped 182 per cent.

Employment and pay rolls in manufacturing industries were up one per cent and two per cent respectively in May from April but were down 18 per cent and 25 per cent from May, 1945, the bureau stated.

Vacation Rights Of Vets Listed

COLUMBUS, Aug. 27.—(AP)—Col. C. W. Goble, state selective service director, announced today a four-point program broadening veterans' job vacation rights.

The new policy was outlined as follows:

(1) A veteran shall be entitled to receive the full vacation to which he is otherwise eligible for the vacation year in which he returns.

(2) Time spent in the military service shall be considered as time actually worked in computing vacation pay.

(3) Contract requirements or stipulations as to the number of hours or percentage of time to be worked to establish eligibility are to be waived.

(4) It should be noted that the vacation year does not always coincide with the calendar year.

(5) The new policy will be effective as of the beginning of the calendar year 1946.
