

'The Small Servant' Chosen For Bette Davis' Broadcast

Bette Davis, two-time Academy Award winner, has selected "The Small Servant," an original one-act play based on characters in Charles Dickens' "The Old Curiosity Shop," as her starring vehicle in the first Hollywood Players' program.

This humorous story, broadcast at 8:30 p. m. Tuesday over CBS, in contrast to Miss Davis' usual heavy emotional roles on the screen, deals with a small servant in the home of Samson Brass, a London solicitor.

The servant, portrayed by Miss Davis, lives on pathetically frugal fare and is locked up nightly after her chores are finished. But she finds a key and gets out!

Six lovely lassies, chosen from among the candidates for the Atlantic City "Miss America" crown, will step up to the microphone for the first official test of their radio IQ, in a unique quiz program to be conducted by Todd Russell, ex-ace of "Double or Nothing," at 9:45 p. m. over MBS.

For their second "Vox Pop" broadcast of the season at 8 p. m. over CBS, Parks Johnson and Warren Hull travel to New York to interview revelers at a Police Athletic League community entertainment and block party in Sutton place, heart of East Side's "Dead End" territory in New York City.

'Bride Wore Boots' Stays At Sigma Until Saturday

One of the raciest bits of horseplay since Lady Godiva sought to establish a new mode in riding habits, continues its stay at the Sigma theatre in the film "The Bride Wore Boots" with Robert Cummings and Barbara Stanwyck in the leading roles.

Bob and Barbara make an ideal pair of funsters in their roles as partners in a marriage strong in love but weak in common interest.

Miss Stanwyck, who, with handsome Patric Knowles, a rejected but persistent suitor, owns a stable of thoroughbred steeplechase horses, is an expert equestrienne. Cummings, an author of best-selling novels extolling the Confederacy's part in the Civil war, can't even abate his hobby-horses. There's where the film begins.

For sheer mystery and suspense like something which you've never seen, you'll not want to miss the film at the Ohio, "The Big Sleep" with Humphrey Bogart and Lauren Bacall. 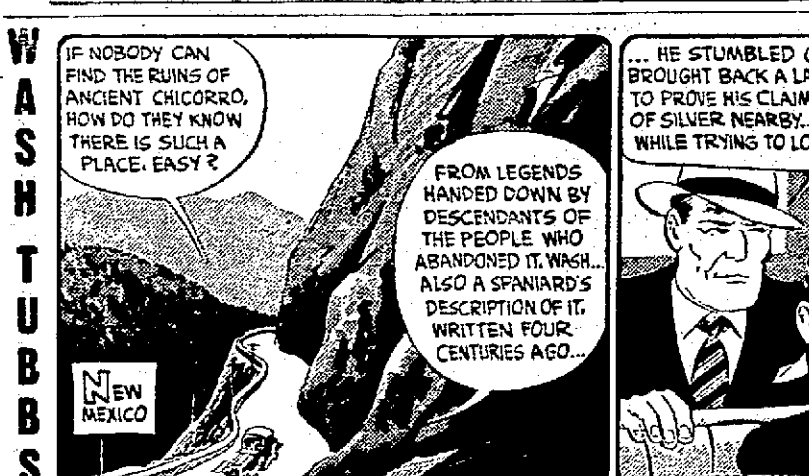
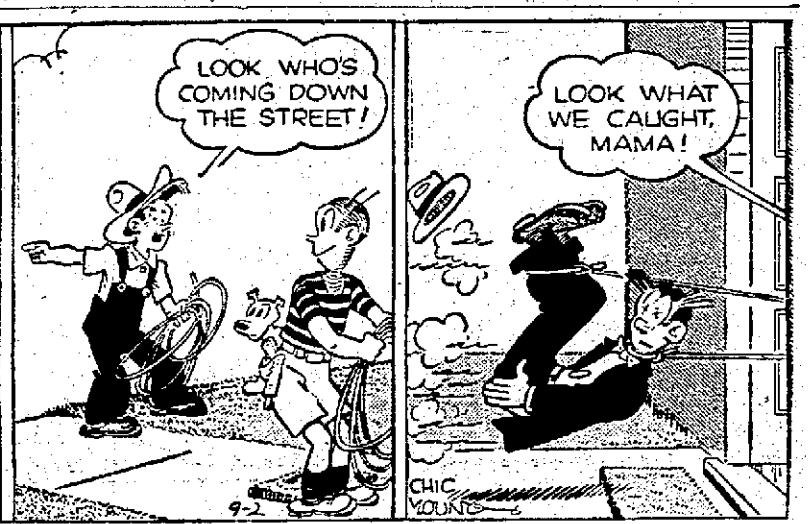
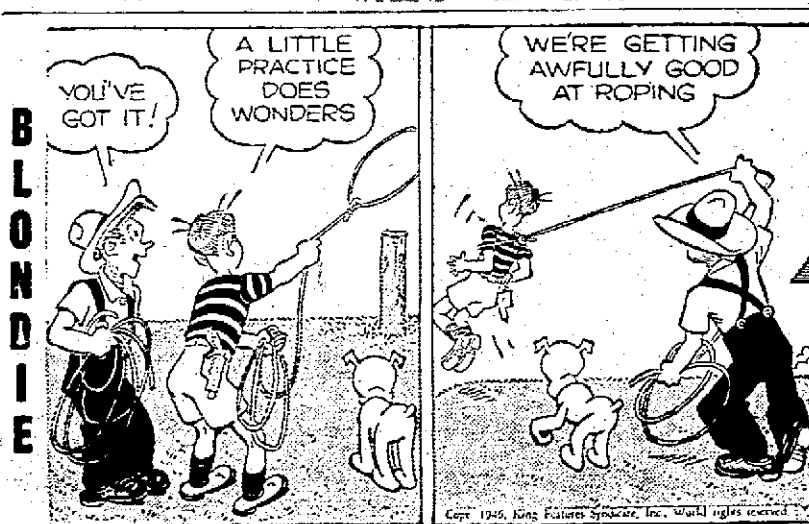
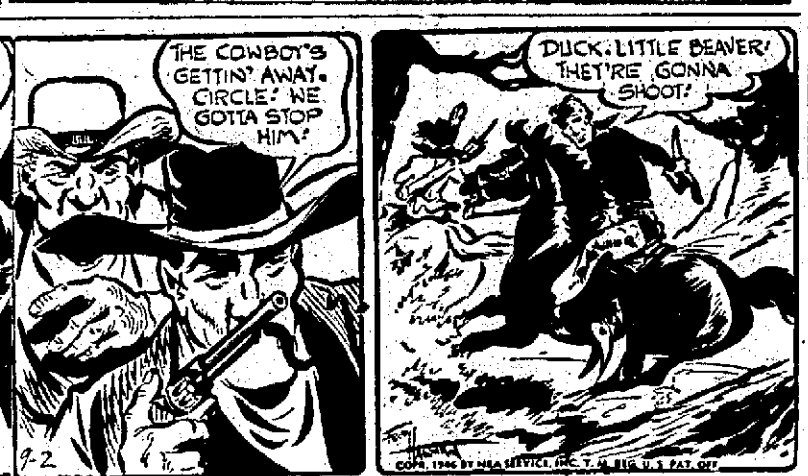
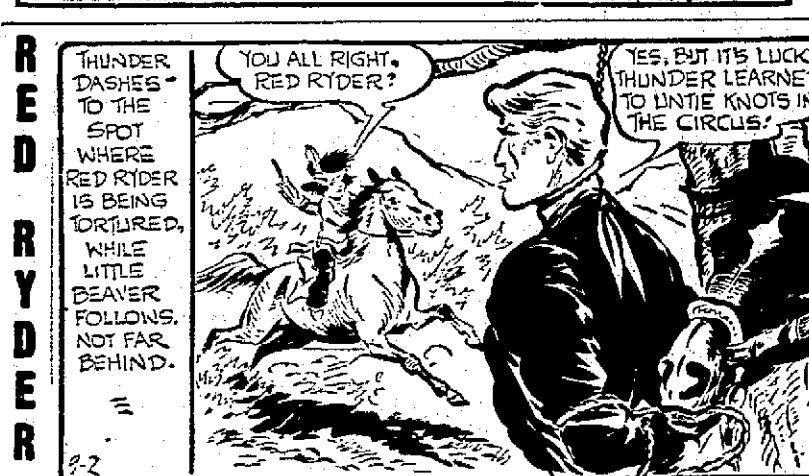
F. C. STATLER DIES
