All-American Has 60,135 for Opener

CLEVELAND (U.P.) - Jubilation was plain all around the All-American Football Conference today as backers of the new pro league studied implications of the record crowd of 60,135 which watched the Cleveland Browns humble the Miami Seahawks, 44-0, in the league's opening game Friday night.

The huge crowd, bettering by 3,000 the old man set by the Washington Redskins and New York Giants at the Polo Grounds, turned out in the town which the National League champion Rams left for Los Angeles. The Rams never had been near that figure. The Browns, playing in huge municipal stadium, had little opposition Friday night. The Browns handled the Seahawks with ease. Lou Groza, a tackle, wound up with high-scoring honors on three field goals and five points after touchdowns. Groza, former Ohio State player, was not a starter but came into the game early and remained as Cleveland scored touchdowns after touchdown. Otto Graham, former Northwestern star, was outstanding with accurate passes.

Five different players scored touchdowns as the Browns tallied in every quarter but the third. There were three exciting runs—one by Tom Colella, who sneaked through center and outran the Seahawks 50 yards to score, one by Edgar Jones, who tried to pass, was trapped and ran 39 yards to the Miami one-yard line, and one by Ray Terrell, who intercepted a Miami pass on his own 24 in the last minute and ran 76 yards to a touchdown.
