Ipar explained, "I didn't tell her I was coming. I wanted to surprise her."

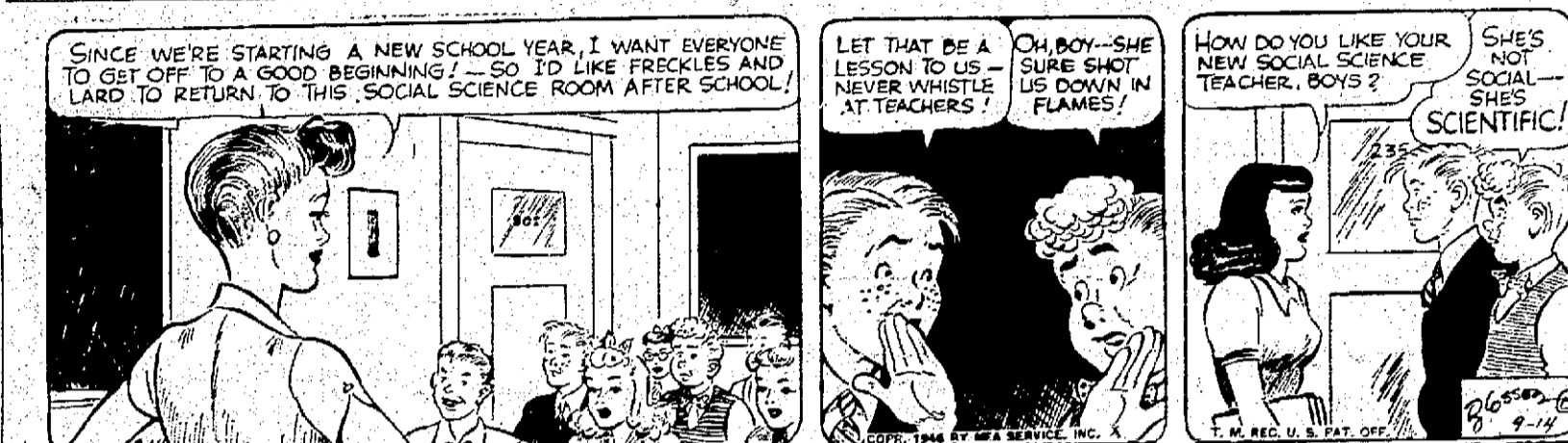
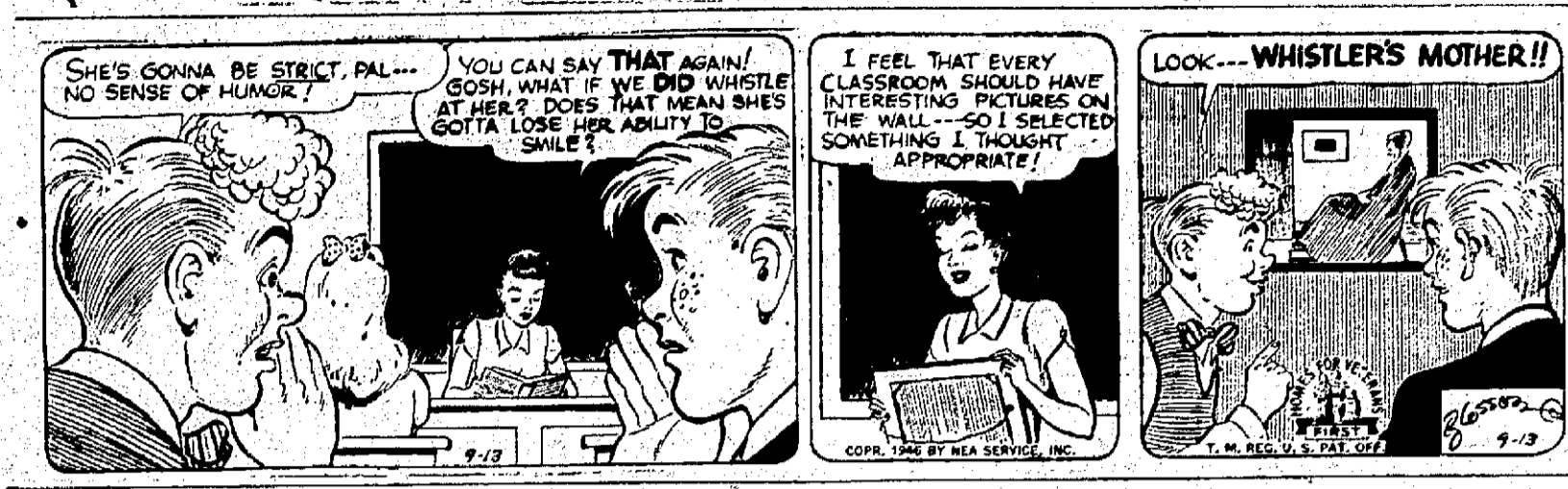
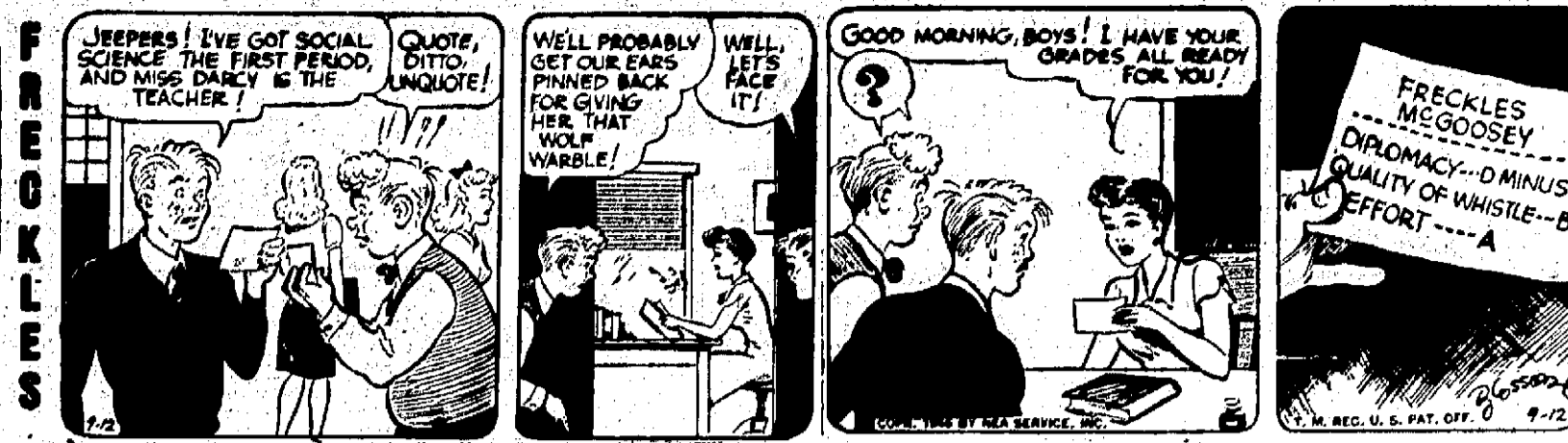
Then he entered a car and was off to meet his thrice married bride and the family of two children he acquired with the marriage.

Urges Business Drop Mystery
ST. LOUIS, Sept. 14—(INS)—C. R. Hook, president of the American Rolling Mill Co., of Middletown, Ohio, urged today that "mystery" be taken out of business as a step toward amicable labor-management relations.

Hook addressed the annual convention of the National Association of Foremen in St. Louis. He said:

"Plans must be adopted and every possible effort put forth so that the fundamental economics of business and particularly of the wage question can be simply and clearly explained."

Hook asserted that the majority of people do not understand business terms such as "reserves, depreciation, amortization," which "to many people represent concealed profits." He continued:

"Taking the mystery out of business is management's front-line responsibility. The dispelling of misunderstanding and lack of understanding which lead to friction and strife should be the operations crossroads of every industrial manager in America."

Frank H. Irelan of Dayton, Ohio, president of the association, called upon the foremen to "demand that management uphold the American principle of business embodying a fair return to the investor and a fair wage to labor."
