

Entertainment Outlook Good On Saturday Theatre Slate

Things along the entertainment line look good for Saturday as far as movies go. Plenty of comedy has been assured just by a look at the theatre guide this Saturday plus a little drama and mystery thrown in for good measure.

Bob Hope, his co-star Joan Caulfield, and the rest of the cast of the film at the Ohio theatre, "Monsieur Beaucaire," wear 18th century costumes. But despite this, the film is more aptly termed hysterical rather than historical. For Hope is at his wit's best in this costume comedy, and that means unrestrained hilarity.

"Home Sweet Home" brings one of the most unusual stories to the screen as it puts in its appearance at the Quilna theatre Friday. The film, which is scheduled to be here until next Friday, tells the story of three youngsters who attempt to solve a crime and nearly make it. Sharing the billing is "Under Nevada Skies" with Roy Rogers.

"Night in Casablanca" with the Marx Brothers opens Saturday at the Sigma theatre and guarantees nearly everyone a splendid time. Fun from beginning to end prevails bringing to the screen something very much out of the ordinary. Sharing the billing is "Swamp Fire" with Johnny Weissmuller.

Opening Sunday at the State theatre will be "Canyon Passage," one of the most beautiful technical color films to be turned out by Hollywood about the West. 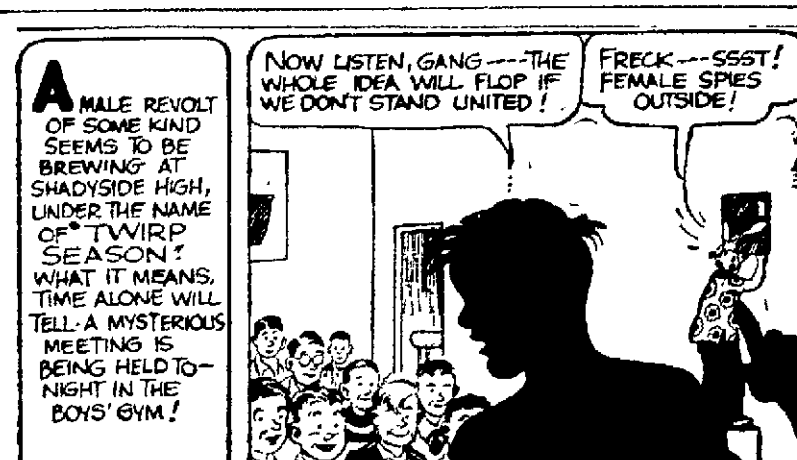
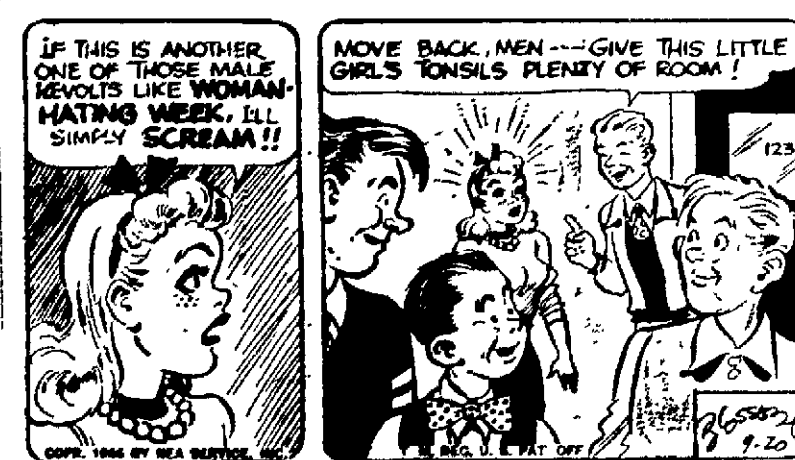

Chicago Radio Opera Series Begins Saturday over MBS

"The Chicago Theatre of the Air" opera and operetta series starring Marjion Claib and distinguished guest stars will open its seventh season from the stage of Chicago's Medinah Temple at 9 p. m. Saturday over MBS.

Three grand operas will be given their first "Theatre of the Air" production during the 1946-47 season, according to Henry Weber, in announcing the schedule for the productions which have become famous for their presentation of opera in English. "La Traviata," "The Marriage of Figaro" and "Rigoletto" are the new productions to be aired, along with many old favorites, including "Rose Marie," "Bittersweet," "Sweethearts," "Faust," "Carmen" and "Naughty Marietta."
