

Jane Russell Due at State In New Film, 'Young Widow'

Jane Russell, the bombshell that hit the headlines because of a movie banned by censors, is making a second try for fame in the film, "Young Widow," opening at the State theatre Thursday.

The picture has the story of a girl, widowed by war, who believes she cannot fall in love again. One of the most poignant stories to reach the screen in a long time, the film has Louis Hayward as the co-star.

The malleable Bob Hope is the star of the hilarious "Monsieur Beaucaire" now showing at the Ohio theatre with Joan Caulfield and Patric Knowles also in leading roles. Hope plays the role of a court barber who suddenly finds himself a duke and his way of impersonating one will keep the most even-minded person in "stitches."

35 Pct. More Toys Predicted For This Year

NEW YORK, Sept. 25—(INS)—Good news for the kids: Toy production for 1946 will reach \$250,000,000 in retail sales, in spite of strikes and material shortages. This means a 35 per cent increase over 1945.

This happy forecast was made today by L. M. MacDonald, president of the Toy Manufacturers of the USA, in a report on an industry-wide survey.

"Shop early," is MacDonald's advice to everyone playing Santa Claus. For, altho toy volume for 1946 will compare favorably with 1939, five million extra children were born during the war years above the peacetime average of the preceding decade, he pointed out.

Thomas Scherman, young American conductor, will direct "The Concert Hour" orchestra in Bizet's "L'Arlesienne Suite," and Debussy's "Sacred Dance" and "Profane Dance" for harp and strings on the MBS network broadcast at 9 p. m. Wednesday.

Anne Baxter, young Hollywood screen star, will repeat her motion picture role in the minister drama, "Guest in the House" on the "Academy Award" program at 9 p. m. over CBS.

In the radio version of the film, which was adapted from a Broadway stage success, Miss Baxter again will play a neurotic girl who creates havoc in the household of her benefactors, only to have her iniquities boomerang and destroy her.

Russian, Slav Rift Reported

PARIS, Sept. 25—(INS)—A rift between the Russians and the Yugoslavs over the Trieste problem was claimed today by authoritative Italian sources. International News Service was told that the Soviet-sponsored exploratory talks between the Italian and the Yugoslav delegates were dragging because Marshal Tito had been unwilling to heed Russian suggestions for a direct agreement.

According to the Italian sources, Yugoslav Vice Premier Edvard Kardelj has been forced into the background because of the current situation.

TOLEDO, Sept. 25—(INS)—Harold Sulter, 39, a Toledo trailer operator, was believed today to have drowned in Lake Erie when a boat overturned with him and two fishing companions.

Harry Gillman and Cleatus Spark were rescued last night as they clung to the capsized boat. Ohio State police, who effected the rescue, were hampered in their search for Sulter by nets in the lake near north shores.

The party's 12-foot motor boat, according to the rescued men, was swamped and one end pulled under water by the motor when the men attempted to turn the boat. Sulter told the other two he would loosen the motor but he failed to come up after diving into the lake.
