Operator Denies Union Charges

WHEELING, W. Va., Sept. 26—(AP)—An official of the Ohio Coal-miners declared "unwarranted" today charges by a United Mine Workers officer that coal operators had refused to cooperate in the UMW's campaign to obtain more meat for the miners.

Ford Sampson, of nearby Bridgeport, O., one of the nine commissioners of the Ohio association, said in a statement that the association "stands ready to cooperate to the fullest extent now and at all times."

Adolph Pacifico, acting president of the UMW's District 6 including Northern West Virginia and Eastern Ohio, said yesterday that the coal operators put "economic interests" before the welfare of their workers, and said he had obtained no help from them in seeking OPA assistance.

Meantime, Wheeling meat packers said the OPA's action in increasing their slaughtering quotas would not increase the meat supply because even regular quotas could not be met.

At his home in Bridgeport, O., Sampson said "some operators offered to do anything suggested by Mr. Pacifico in the fight for meat for coal miners."

"One company in particular, with a high percentage of tonnage, is slaughtering meat and furnishing it to the miners. This is being done under OPA regulations and at a loss to the company. The sole purpose is to furnish meat to the miners."

Complications Galore

Trying To Probe Kaiser Empire Proves Big Job Even for Determined Congressmen

WASHINGTON, Sept. 26—(UP)—"When a man has stock in a company that holds stock in a company that has stock in (I am not, either, quoting Alice in Wonderland) the situation does get a little complicated."

Whew. The man involved in this little complication is Henry J. Kaiser, who built 1,000 ships, heads a billion dollar industrial empire, and who tries—but does not always succeed—to keep in mind a million dollars here and a couple of million there.

The man who voiced the dismayed first sentence in this dispatch is Rep. Alvin F. Weichel of Sandusky, Ohio. As a member of the congressional committee investigating shipbuilding profits, he managed to keep the portly Kaiser's bald dome changing color like a chameleon on a Scotch plaid blanket.

The varying shades of the Kaiser toggin provided an excellent barometer of his temper. Pink meant that he was only in a medium sore; scarlet indicated that he was getting good and mad; purple proved that he had to restrain himself from chopping down the congressman and using him for propeller shaft stuffing in a Liberty ship.

Weichel said (ignoring the purple) that he couldn't understand how the banks had loaned \$5,000,000 to Kaiser's Permanente Metal Co., when it only had \$460,000 in capital.

"Because the company had integrity," began Kaiser. "The men behind it had integrity. . . . Yes, but it had no assets, hardly," interrupted Weichel. "Wall," explained Kaiser, "if that's the way you talk, I'd like to see you try to borrow \$5,000,000 from a bank."

The purple turned to scarlet. Weichel had no reply. Kaiser chuckled. The scarlet receded to pink. And so it went, as the congressmen and their lawyer tried to lead Kaiser thru a financial setup more complicated by far than a Joshua Hendy steam engine.

Kaiser used to own a chunk of the Nundy Engine Co., too, but let's not go into that. He runs 28 different industries; the government still owes him millions; he owes the government other millions.

Rep. Fred Bradley of Mich. said he was disturbed by the fact

but while he still was a senator, he investigated Kaiser's operations. "Investigated us good," Kaiser said. "And announced in his formal report that we built those ships \$250,000,000 cheaper than anybody else could of."

Ooops. Bad grammar, but Kaiser's round. I'm beginning to like the guy. Only fellow I ever knew who forgot \$11,000,000.
