

'Leave Her to Heaven' Due At Lyric Theatre Tuesday

Telling the story of a woman whose only passion was to possess anything she loved, 'Leave Her to Heaven' with Gene Tierney, Jeanne Crain and Cornel Wilde opens at the Lyric theatre Tuesday.

Miss Tierney appears in one of the most outstanding roles of her screen career as the vixen who tries every way she can to rule the lives of both her husband and sister, but by some quirk of fate is ruled out on both scores, but even when dead tries to claim both.

Noted Swindler Seized by FBI

MIAMI, Fla., Sept. 30—(INS)—Antonio Navarro Fernandez, a 52-year-old thin, slightly-stopped Spaniard described by the FBI as an international swindler and confidence man, is being held by federal authorities in Miami under \$100,000 bond.

Fernandez was arrested Saturday as he stepped off a plane arriving from Curacao, Dutch West Indies. He was charged with violating the national stolen property act as an outgrowth of a swindle which allegedly netted him some \$125,000.

Arraigned Saturday before U. S. Commissioner Roger E. Davis, Fernandez denied any knowledge of the crime.

Federal agents alleged the Spaniard, who is known by at least 20 aliases, swindled the money from a prominent Washington, D. C. resident in Canada last July after telling a story of having millions of dollars in United States bank safe deposit boxes.

New Election Frauds Charged

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Sept. 30—(INS)—The Kansas City Star charged in a page one story in their Sunday edition yesterday that election frauds came to Kansas City with the Aug. 6 primary.

The Star said the alleged frauds had not been city-wide in character, but had "come to the surface in several wards."

It warned that election frauds of the 1920's which "made Kansas City elections a joke, started just by what many years ago."

No direct implication was made as to who was responsible for the alleged frauds, evidence of which has been turned over to U. S. Attorney Sam Wear for investigation.

Wear indicated that the information would be put in digest form and forwarded to the Department of Justice for consideration, The Star said.

The newspaper noted, however, that "fantastic" returns had been reported from the first, second and 14th wards, strongholds of the Jim Pendergast machine, and populated for the most part by Italians, Negroes and Mexicans.

Diamond Mine Offer Rejected

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa, Sept. 30—(AP)—Dr. John T. Williamson has rejected an offer of 2,000,000 pounds (\$8,000,000) from the Debeers world diamond interests for his newly-discovered diamond mine in Tanganyika. It was reported here today.

Williamson said he was not much interested in money and preferred to keep the mine and sell his diamonds as he chooses. "I couldn't possibly spend 2,

000,000 pounds on the kind of simple living I prefer," he said. Williamson has given a one-third share in the mine to his brother, Percy, who was wounded while serving with the Canadian army in Europe.

Wreck Blamed On Wall of Air

LONDON, Sept. 30—(INS)—A theory that the crash of Capt. Geoffrey de Havilland's jet plane over the Thames estuary may have been caused by the daring test pilot's attempt to break thru the so-called "wall of air compressibility" was expressed today by aeronautical experts.

The London Daily Express said that authorities believe De Havilland was putting his plane thru a final all-out power dive, at a speed approaching that of sound—760 miles per hour at sea level—when the ship suddenly flew to pieces.

In effect the plane's speed was so great that it met disaster by crashing against a solid wall of compressed air, the paper said.

The experts doubted that the crash was caused by engine defects or by faults in the wings or fuselage. They pointed out that the plane had been tested many times prior to the fateful flight.
