

Three Top Stars Head Bill Slated for State Thursday

Combining the talents of three top stars, sparkling with refreshing dialogue and boasting a modern believable story, "Lover Come Back," opens at the State theatre Thursday.

George Brent, Lucille Ball and Vera Zorina are starred in the comedy which is being hailed as the funniest movie fans have had the pleasure of seeing to date.
