ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., Oct. 4—Two large-scale liquor thefts here were being investigated today by the FBI and alcohol tax unit agents.

The tax unit agents were holding two prominent Bedford businessmen, who were said to have admitted theft of at least 325 gallons of whiskey from a government bonded warehouse in Bedford. It was valued at more than \$6,500.

The FBI, meanwhile, sought a truckload of whiskey stolen last night from the yard of the Motor Cargo, Inc. here, across from the Central police station. The cargo consisted of 550 cases of whiskey, valued at \$23,760.
