BUYING DEMAND BOOSTS GRAINS

CHICAGO, Oct. 5—(AP)—A trade report that the government will attempt to move 100,000,000 bushels of wheat out of the north-

west before close of lake navigation brought new buying demand into feed grains today. The November oats delivery led the upturn.

At 10 a. m. (CST) oats were up 3-13, November 83 1/2, corn was ahead, 3-5, January 81-35 1/2, and wheat showed gains of 3-1/2, January \$2.01 1/2.

Veteran's Wife Is Found Slain

DETROIT, Oct. 5—(AP)—The body of the 30-year-old, blonde wife of an Army veteran, her forehead crushed, was found today in the laundry room of a Detroit apartment building.

Identified by police as Mrs. Ellen Kretzner, the dead woman apparently had been struck several times with a heavy instrument, the investigators' preliminary report said.

No evidence of rape was found, they declared. A janitor unlocked the laundry room door to admit the woman tenant who found the body. He told police he had locked the room at 9 p. m. Friday and had the only key.

Beside the body police found a key which fitted the apartment occupied by the woman and her husband, Leo, a former Army cavalryman. The husband, police were informed, worked nights and had not arrived home.

Churchill Pleads Allied Friendship

BLACKPOOL, Eng., Oct. 5—(INS)—Former Prime Minister Winston Churchill today called upon Soviet Russia to "allow" preservation of Allied friendship that prevailed thruout the war.

The wartime leader of Great Britain spoke to a crowded meeting of conservative party organizations in the huge empress ballroom of the Blackpool Winter Gardens.

He said: "We should all like to preserve the wartime friendship with the Russian people and the Soviet government if they will allow us to do so and will stop what Bevin (Foreign Secretary Ernest Bevin) calls a 'war of nerves'."
