

# Suspense Characterizes Film Slated for Sigma Wednesday

A rare feeling of suspense and mystery characterizes "Shadow of a Woman" which opens Wednesday at the Sigma theatre, replacing "The Stranger."

Helmut Dantine is particularly excellent in the film, cutting both a dashing and sinister picture as Dr. Eric Ryder. His marriage to Brook, Andrea King, after a five-day courtship forebodes evil when he is almost crushed by a dislodged boulder. Her who knows little or nothing of her husband, except that he's a doctor who places unusual stock in the curative powers of diet, has a strong feeling that the incident was not an accident. Sharing the bill opening at the same time is "Strange Holiday."

"The Ohio's 'Cloak and Dagger' with Gary Cooper, Robert Alda and Lill Palmer is more than attracting the attention of fans. 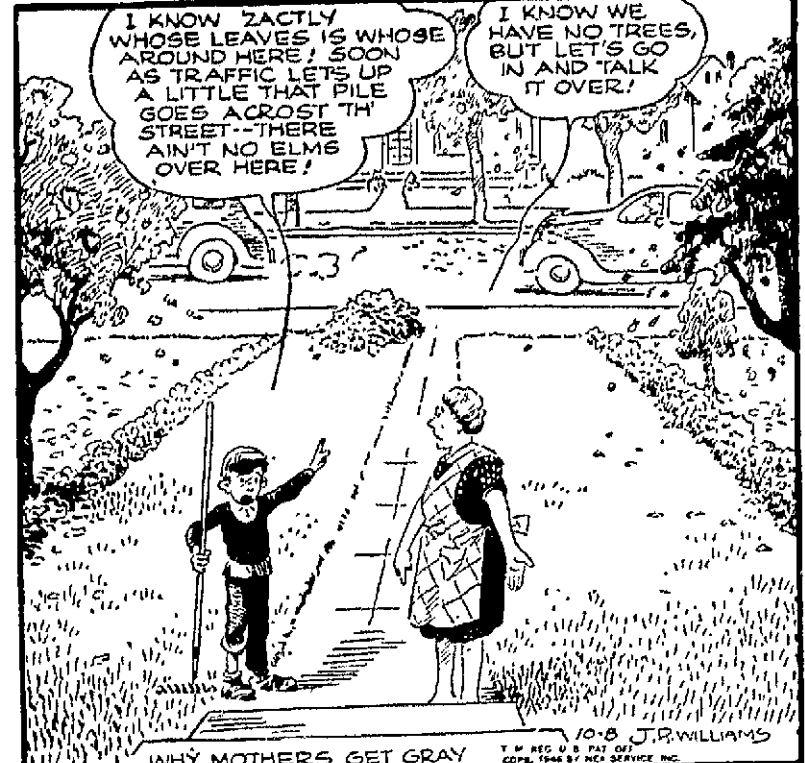
**Spellman Warns Reds Destroying America**  
NEW YORK, Oct. 8.—(UP)—Francis Cardinal Spellman warned last night that Communists have made "deep inroads" into the United States and were trying "to grind into dust the blessed freedoms."

Speaking before a "world peace rally" of the Roman Catholic Holy Name society, Spellman predicted that Archbishop Stepinac and the priests being tried with him by the Yugoslav government would be convicted. He called the trial a "heavenly justice" and denounced the Tito government as "satanic Soviet syphants."

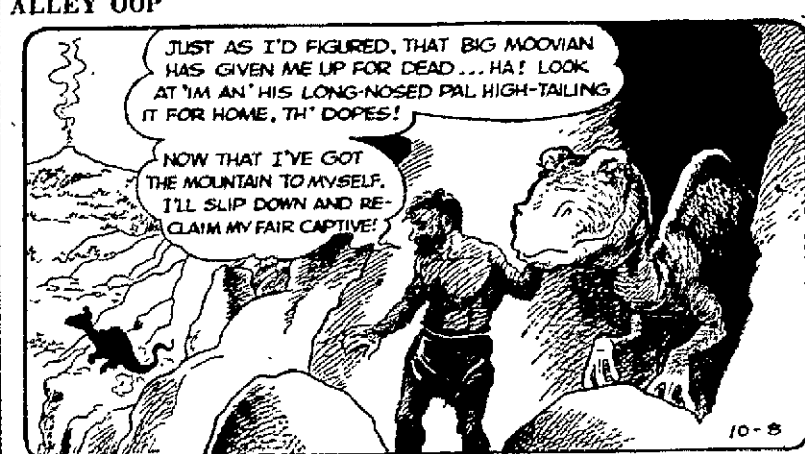
Cardinal Spellman said he did not fear for Stepinac, who would "gloriously and gladly" accept his martyrdom.

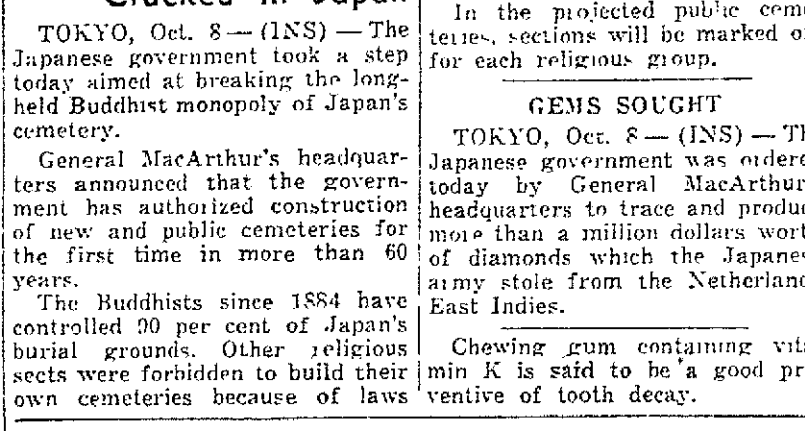

## Cemetery Monopoly Cracked in Japan

TOKYO, Oct. 8.—(INS)—The Japanese government took a step today aimed at breaking the long-held Buddhist monopoly of Japan's cemeteries.

General MacArthur's headquarters announced that the government has authorized construction of new and public cemeteries for the first time in more than 60 years.

The Buddhists since 1884 have controlled 90 per cent of Japan's burial grounds. Other religious sects were forbidden to build their own cemeteries because of laws which prohibited construction of new burial grounds or expansion of old ones.

In the protected public cemeteries, sections will be marked off for each religious group.

# John Garfield Plays Pugilist In Odets' Drama 'Golden Boy'

Screen Star John Garfield, who rose from the slums of New York to become one of filmland's great actors, will make his second stellar appearance on the "Hollywood Players" series at 9:30 p. m. Tuesday over CBS when he plays the leading role in Clifford Odets' successful stage and screen play, "Golden Boy." The story deals with a young prize fighter hoping to continue his pugilistic career despite the objections of his family who had always wanted him to become a violinist.

Mike Shayne, wide-awake Irish detective, turns his talents towards solving a murder which was dreamed about and then actually happens during the "Michael Shayne" mystery show at 8 p. m. over MBS. A businessman, terrorized by a vivid nightmare in which he kills his best friend, consults psychiatrists to help him with his problem. When they do him no good, he turns to Shayne. The dreamed-up murder, meanwhile, actually takes place and Shayne follows thru to save an innocent man and pin the guilt on the real killer.

**WAA Adopts Rigid Freight Program**  
WASHINGTON, Oct. 8.—(UP)—The War Assets Administration reported today that it has adopted a rigid freight conservation program to prevent any unnecessary strain on the nation's overloaded rail transportation system.

The program calls for prompt loading and unloading of cars, ordering no more cars than are absolutely needed and careful timing of orders to prevent cars from lying idle.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 8.—(UP)—A congressional plea for a crack-down on the Communist party was under study today by Attorney General Tom C. Clark.

In a letter to Clark, Rep. J. Parnell Thomas (R-N.J.), said the Communist party—"the Moscow-directed fifth column operating in the United States"—was openly violating the law.
